BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 21 of P.L.1966, c.113 (C.34:11-56a20) is amended to read as follows:
- 21. Every employer of employees subject to this act shall keep a true and accurate record of the hours worked by each and the wages paid by him to each and shall furnish to the commissioner or the director or their authorized representative upon demand a sworn statement of the same. Such records shall be open to inspection by the commissioner or the director or their authorized representative at any reasonable time. No employer shall be found guilty of violating this provision for failure to keep a true and accurate record of the hours worked by outside salesmen, buyers of poultry, eggs, cream [or], milk or other perishable commodities in their natural or raw state [or], homeworkers legally employed in accordance with the laws of this State or any person employed in a bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacity 1, except that no exemption from record keeping pursuant to this section in regard to any person employed in a bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacity shall be construed to permit an employer to pay wages at a rate which violates the provisions of section 5 of P.L. 1966, c. 113 (C. 34:11-56a4)¹.

STATEMENT

This bill amends the "New Jersey State Wage and Hour Law" to provide that employers shall not be penalized for failing to keep records of the hours worked by their executive, administrative and professional employees.

Currently, the "New Jersey State Wage and Hour Law" requires employers to keep records of the hours worked by their executive, administrative or professional employees. Executive, administrative and professional employees are subject to the minimum wage provisions of that law but they are not subject to the law's overtime payment provisions.

Finally, the bill amends the law to provide that employers shall not be required to keep records of the hours worked by buyers of perishable commodities.

The Assembly Labor Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 946(1R).

This bill amends the "New Jersey State Wage and Hour Law" to provide that employers shall not be penalized for failing to keep records of the hours worked by their executive, administrative and professional employees. However, the bill does provide that even though employers are not required to keep a record of the hours worked by persons employed in bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacities, they will nonetheless be required to pay those persons at least the minimum wage.

The bill also amends that law to exempt employers of all buyers of perishable commodities, and not just buyers of poultry, eggs or cream, from keeping records of the hours worked by these buyers.

The Senate Commerce Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 946.

However, the committee amendment to the bill provides further that even though employers are not required to keep a record of the hours worked by persons employed in bona fide executive, administrative or professional capacities, they will nonetheless be required to pay those persons at least the minimum wage.

The bill also amends that law to exempt employers of all buyers of perishable commodities, and not just buyers of poultry, eggs or cream, from keeping records of the hours worked by these buyers.
