PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1992 SESSION

By Assemblymen DeCROCE and MARTIN

AN ACT concerning information on organ donations, amending R.S.39:3-10 and R.S.39:3-41.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.39:3-10 is amended to read as follows:

39:3-10. No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a public 7 highway in this State unless licensed to do so in accordance with 8 this article. No person under 17 years of age shall be licensed to 9 drive motor vehicles, nor shall a person be licensed until he has 10 passed a satisfactory examination as to his ability as an 11 operator. The examination shall include a test of the applicant's 12 vision, his ability to understand traffic control devices, his 13 knowledge of safe driving practices and of the effects that 14 ingestion of alcohol or drugs has on a person's ability to operate 15 a motor vehicle, his knowledge of such portions of the mechanism 16 of motor vehicles as is necessary to insure the safe operation of a 17 vehicle of the kind or kinds indicated by the applicant and of the 18 laws and ordinary usages of the road and a demonstration of his 19 20 ability to operate a vehicle of the class designated.

The director shall expand the driver's license examination by 21 20%. The additional questions to be added shall consist solely of 22 questions developed in conjunction with the State Department of 23 Health concerning the use of alcohol or drugs as related to 24 highway safety. The director shall develop in conjunction with the 25 State Department of Health supplements to the driver's manual 26 which shall include information necessary to answer any question 27 on the driver's license examination concerning alcohol or drugs 28 as related to highway safety. 29

The director shall expand the driver's license examination to 30 include ¹[one or more questions concerning] a question asking 31 whether the applicant is aware of¹ the provisions of the "Uniform 32 Anatomical Gift Act," P.L.1969, c.161 (C.26:6-57 et seq.) ¹[, the 33 beneficial uses of donated body organs and tissues, or] and¹ the 34 procedure for indicating on the driver's license the intention to 35 make ¹[such]¹ a donation ¹of body organs or tissues¹ pursuant to 36 P.L.1978, c.181 (C.39:3-12.2). 37

Any person applying for a driver's license to operate a motor vehicle or motorized bicycle in this State shall surrender to the director any current driver's license issued to him by another state upon his receipt of a driver's license for this State. The

a. Motorcycles, except that for the purposes of this section,
motorcycle shall not include any three-wheeled motor vehicle
equipped with a single cab with glazing enclosing the occupant,

and automotive steering;

b. Omnibuses as classified by R.S.39:3-10.1 and school buses

26 The director, upon payment of the lawful fee and after he or a 27 person authorized by him has examined the applicant and is 28 satisfied of the applicant's ability as an operator, may, in his 29 discretion, license the applicant to drive a motor vehicle. The license shall authorize him to drive any registered vehicle, of the 30 31 kind or kinds indicated, and shall expire, except as otherwise provided, on the last day of the forty-eighth calendar month 32 33 following the calendar month in which such license was issued.

The director may, at his discretion and for good cause shown, issue licenses which shall expire on a date fixed by him. The fee for such licenses shall be fixed by the director in amounts proportionately less or greater than the fee herein established.

The director shall waive the payment of fees for issuance of omnibus endorsements whenever an applicant establishes to the director's satisfaction that said applicant will use the omnibus endorsement exclusively for operating omnibuses owned by a nonprofit organization duly incorporated under Title 15 or 16 of the Revised Statutes or Title 15A of the New Jersey Statutes.

50 The director shall issue licenses for the following license period 51 on and after the first day of the calendar month immediately 52 preceding the commencement of such period, such licenses to be 53 effective immediately.

All applications for renewals of licenses shall be made on forms

prescribed by the director and in accordance with procedures
 established by him.

The director in his discretion may refuse to grant a license to drive motor vehicles to a person who is, in his estimation, not a proper person to be granted such a license, but no defect of the applicant shall debar him from receiving a license unless it can be shown by tests approved by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles that the defect incapacitates him from safely operating a motor vehicle.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 3, 1992

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 377 with committee amendments.

As amended by the committee, this bill seeks to make drivers more fully aware of the scientific and medical benefits derived from the donation of body organs and of the procedure for indicating on their drivers' licenses their wish to make such a donation.

Existing law permits drivers to indicate on their licenses their intention to donate their eyes and other organs upon death. However, beyond stating that this notation may be made on a driver's license, the New Jersey Driver Manual contains no further information on organ donation.

The amended bill requires the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, following consultation with the New Jersey Organ and Tissue Sharing Network, to include in the driver's manual information explaining the provisions of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," P.L.1969, c.161 (C.26:6-57 et seq.) and the beneficial uses of donated body organs and tissues. The manual would also be required to describe the procedure for noting on a driver's license the intention to donate an organ pursuant to P.L.1978, c.181 (C.39:3-12.2). The amended bill further requires that a question be included in the written examination for a driver's license asking whether a driver's license applicant is aware of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," and the procedure for indicating on the driver's license the intention to make an organ donation.

The committee amended the bill to require that a question be included in the written examination for a driver's license asking whether a driver's license applicant is aware of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," and the procedure for indicating on the driver's license the intention to make an organ donation. This amendment replaces the original language of the bill which would have required that the written examination include one or more questions about organ donation procedures. The amendment is intended to address a concern raised by the Division of Motor Vehicles about including questions on the written examination which do not measure the ability of a driver's license applicant to drive a motor vehicle.

The committee also amended the bill to permit the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to distribute all remaining copies of the existing manual before reprinting it with the additional information required under this bill. This amendment is intended to reduce the costs to the division of implementing this provision.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1992-93 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed. SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Senate Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 377 [1R].

This bill requires the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, following consultation with the New Jersey Organ and Tissue Sharing Network, to include in the driver's manual information explaining the provisions of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," P.L.1969, c.161 (C.26:6-57 et seq.) and the beneficial uses of donated body organs and tissues. The manual would also be required to describe the procedure for noting on a driver's license the intention to donate an organ pursuant to P.L.1978, c.181 (C.39:3-12.2). In order to reduce the costs to the division of implementing this change in the manual, the bill permits the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to distribute all remaining copies of the existing manual before reprinting it with the additional information.

The bill also requires that a question be included in the written examination for a driver's license asking whether a driver's license applicant is aware of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," and the procedure for indicating on the driver's license the intention to make an organ donation.

Existing law permits drivers to indicate on their licenses their intention to donate their eyes and other organs upon death; however, beyond stating that this notation may be made on a driver's license, the New Jersey Driver Manual contains no further information on organ donation.

[FIRST REPRINT] ASSEMBLY, No. 377

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: September 18, 1992

Assembly Bill No. 377 (1R) of 1992 requires the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in the Department of Law and Public Safety, in consultation with the New Jersey Organ and Tissue Sharing Network, to include in the driver's manual information explaining the provisions of the "Uniform Anatomical Gift Act" and the beneficial uses of donated body organs and tissues. The bill also requires that one question pertaining to organ donation be included in the written examination for a driver's license.

The bill also permits DMV to distribute all remaining copies of the existing driver's manual before reprinting the manual in conformance with this bill's requirements.

The Office of Legislative Services estimates that enactment of this bill will have no fiscal impact, assuming that DMV uses its current supply of driver's manuals before new manuals, which conform with this bill, are printed.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.
