#### P.L.1992, CHAPTER 119, approved October 22, 1992 1992 Senate No. 134

AN ACT concerning sale or purchase of articles produced by inmates of correctional institutions within the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections, and supplementing article 5 of chapter 4 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, the Department of Corrections may enter into contracts with any other state, or any political subdivision thereof, for the sale of articles or goods manufactured or produced by the inmates of any correctional institution within its jurisdiction.

The Commissioner of Corrections shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, a notice setting forth a description and a price list of all the articles which are manufactured or produced by the inmates of the correctional institutions under his jurisdiction and which are available for sale to other states and their political subdivisions. In a manner the commissioner determines to be appropriate, the notice shall be made available to other states and their political subdivisions.

b. The Department of Corrections may also enter into contracts with any other state, or political subdivision thereof, to purchase articles or goods manufactured or produced by the inmates of correctional institutions within that other state or political subsdivision.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Authorizes Department of Corrections to sell inmate manufactured goods to other states and purchase such goods from other states.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 134.

Senate Bill No. 134 authorizes the Department of Corrections through the Bureau of State Use Industries to enter into contracts with other states or their political subdivisions for the sale of articles or goods manufactured or produced by the inmates of New Jersey's correctional institutions. To facilitate such sales, the bill directs the Commissioner of Corrections to prepare and make available a description and a price list of all the articles which are manufactured or produced by State inmates.

Under current law, articles and goods produced by inmates may be sold only to New Jersey governmental units; they may not be sold in the open market where they might unfairly compete with those manufactured by the private sector. The provisions of this bill are consistent with this long standing policy. The only change is that the bill would authorize the Department of Corrections to sell inmate produced articles and goods to other states; this bill does not alter in any way the current prohibition against the sale of inmate manufactured articles and goods on the open market. Under current law, articles and goods produced by inmates may be sold only to New Jersey governmental units; they may not be sold in the open market where they might unfairly compete with those manufactured by the private sector. The provisions of this bill are consistent with this long standing policy. The only change is that the bill would authorize the Department of Corrections to sell inmate produced articles and goods to other states; this bill does not alter in any way the current prohibition against the sale of inmate manufactured articles and goods on the open market. The bill also permits the Department of Corrections to purchase goods from correctional industries programs in other states.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1992 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
