1 AN ACT exempting certified pedorthists from the provisions of 2 the "Orthotist and Prosthetist Licensing Act" and amending 3 P.L.1991, c.512. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 6 State of New Jersey: 1. Section 18 of P.L.1991, c.512 (C.45:12B-18) is amended to 7 read as follows: 8 · • 18. The provisions of this act shall not apply to: 9 10 a. The activities and services of any person who is licensed to practice medicine and surgery, dentistry or podiatry by this State; 11 12 b. The activities and services of a student, fellow, or trainee in orthotics or prosthetics pursuing a course of study at an 13 accredited college or university, or working in a recognized 14 training center or research facility, if these activities and 15 services constitute a part of his course of study under a 16 supervisor licensed pursuant to this act; [or] 17 c. The application of upper extremity adaptive equipment, 18 finger splints and hand splints by an occupational therapist or the 19 use of generic braces for evaluation purposes by a licensed 20 physical therapist when such bracing is for a term of less than 21 three months and the braces do not become the patient's 22 23 property; or d. The activities and services of a certified pedorthist ¹; 24 except that this subsection shall not prevent any certified 25 26 pedorthist from applying for and obtaining a license under the provisions of P.L.1991, c.512 (C.45:12B-1 et seq.) limiting that 27 28 person's practice of orthotics and prosthetics to the ankle and below¹. As used in this subsection: "certified pedorthist" means 29 a person certified by the American Board for Certification in 30 Pedorthics, or its successor, in the design, manufacture, fit and 31 modification of shoes and related foot appliances from the ankle 32 and below as prescribed by a licensed doctor of medicine or 33 podiatry for the amelioration of painful or disabling conditions of 34 the foot; and "foot appliances" includes, but is not limited to, 35 36 prosthetic fillers and orthotic appliances for use from the ankle and below. 37 (cf: P.L.1991, c.512, s.18) 38 ¹2. Section 2 of P.L. 1991, c. 512 (C. 45:12B-2) is amended to 39 read as follows: 40 2. The Legislature finds and declares that: 41

a. The practice of orthotics and prosthetics may, if
unregulated, seriously harm or endanger the health, safety, and
well-being of the citizens of this State;

b. Citizens of this State need, and will benefit from, an
assurance of initial and ongoing professional competence among
orthotists and prosthetists practicing in this State;

c. The present unregulated system for dispensing orthotic and
prosthetic care does not adequately meet the needs or serve the
interests of the public; and

It is necessary for this State to regulate and license the 8 practice of orthotics and prosthetics for the purpose of 9 protecting the citizens of this State from injury or harm caused 10 by ill-prepared, incompetent, unscrupulous, or unauthorized 11 practitioners and to assure the highest degree of professional 12 conduct on the part of orthotists and prosthetists practicing in 13 this State.

14 [The Legislature further finds and declares that peer regulation 15 and the creation of a new board of examiners to carry out the 16 provisions of this act are not in the public interest, and it is thus 17 necessary to devise a regulatory mechanism which is consonant 18 with the licensing policies of this State.]¹

The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Assembly, No. 879.

This bill exempts certified pedorthists from the provisions of the "Orthotist and Prosthetist Licensing Act," P.L.1991, c.512 (C.45:12B-1 et seq.). A "certified pedorthist" is defined as a person certified by the American Board of Certification in Pedorthics, or its successor, in the design, manufacture, fit and modification of shoes and related foot appliances from the ankle and below as prescribed by a licensed doctor of medicine or podiatry for the amelioration of painful or disabling conditions of the foot. "Foot appliances" as used in the bill includes, but is not limited to, prosthetic fillers and orthotic appliances for use from the ankle and below.

The Senate Commerce Committee reports favorably and with 2 committee amendments Assembly, No. 879.

This bill, as amended by the committee, exempts certified 4 pedorthists from the provisions of the "Orthotist and Prosthetist Licensing Act," P.L.1991, c.512 (C.45:12B-1 et seq.), but specifies

- 6 that a certified pedorthist may apply for and obtain a license under that act limiting that person's practice of orthotics and prosthetics
- 8 to the ankle and below. A "certified pedorthist" is defined as a person certified by the American Board of Certification in
- 10 Pedorthics, or its successor, in the design, manufacture, fit and modification of shoes and related foot appliances from the ankle

12 and below as prescribed by a licensed doctor of medicine or podiatry for the amelioration of painful or disabling conditions of

14 the foot. "Foot appliances" as used in the bill includes, but is not limited to, prosthetic fillers and orthotic appliances for use from

16 the ankle and below.

In addition, the committee made a technical amendment to that 18 act.
