AN ACT concerning the use of protective helmets by 1 motorcyclists and amending P.L.1967, c.237. 2 3 4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 5 State of New Jersey: 1. Section 6 of P.L.1967, c.237 (C.39:3-76.7) is amended to 6 7 read as follows: 8 6. a. No person shall operate or ride upon a motorcycle unless he wears a securely fitted protective helmet of a size proper for 9 10 that person and of a type approved by the director. Such a 11 helmet must be equipped with either a neck or chin strap and be 12 reflectorized on both sides thereof. The director is authorized 13 and empowered to adopt rules and regulations covering the types 14 of helmets and the specifications therefor and to establish and 15 maintain a list of approved helmets which meet the specifications as established hereunder. For the purposes of this section, 16 motorcycle shall not include any three-wheeled motor vehicle 17 18 equipped with a single cab with glazing enclosing the occupant, 19 seats similar to those of a passenger vehicle or truck, seat belts 20 and automotive steering. 21 b. The director shall not assess motor vehicle points for the 22 failure of a motorcycle operator or rider to wear a protective 23 helmet.

The Assembly Judiciary, Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 463.

This bill prohibits the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in the Department of Law and Public Safety from assessing motor vehicle points for the failure of a motorcycle operator or rider to wear a protective helmet as required by law. The bill amends N.J.S.A.39:3-76.7 which requires the wearing of a helmet and authorizes the director to adopt rules and regulations establishing a list of approved helmets. The director currently assesses a two-point penalty for this offense under the authority granted him by P.L.1982, c.43 (C.39:5-30.5) to establish points by regulation. This bill would prohibit imposition of these two points. The existing monetary penalty for failing to wear a helmet while operating a motorcycle would continue to apply. N.J.S.A.39:3-79 provides for a \$25.00 fine.
