INTRODUCED MARCH 16, 1992

By Senators DIMON and Cowan

AN ACT concerning special registration plates and supplementing
chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statues.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Upon application of any person who is the holder of a Silver Star medal as certified ¹[by the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs] on the applicant's DD-214 form or on a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty¹, the director shall issue, for the motor vehicle owned or leased by the person, distinctive plates bearing a design approved by the director in addition to the registration number and other markings or identification prescribed by law. The plates shall bear the words "Silver Star" and depict the Silver Star emblem. There shall be no cost to the applicant for these special plates other than the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles.
- b. The surviving spouse of a former holder of the Silver Star who is eligible to operate a motor vehicle in this state under the provision of R.S.39:3-10 may retain the special license plates obtained by the deceased spouse pursuant to this section for display on a motor vehicle registered to the surviving spouse under the provisions of R.S.39:3-4.
- c. The director shall promulgate rules and regulations governing the issuance and use of these registration plates.
- 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the fifth month after enactment.

Provides special registration plates for Silver Star medal recipients.

The Assembly Veterans and Military Affairs Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 576 (1R).

This bill permits holders of the Silver Star medal to obtain special license plates for their motor vehicles. Eligibility for the plate shall be established by certification of the medal on the applicant's DD-214 form or on a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty. There shall be no cost to the applicant for these special plates other than the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles.

The bill permits the surviving spouse of a former holder of the Silver Star to retain the special plates for display on a motor vehicle registered to that surviving spouse.

The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles is required by the bill to promulgates rules for the issuance and use of the plates.

After the Medal of Honor and the Distinguished Service Cross, the Silver Star is the most prestigious medal for gallantry in action awarded by the armed forces of the United States. It is given for combat against an enemy of this country in a foreign war or for service with friendly foreign forces in an armed conflict in which the United States is not a belligerent party.
