AN ACT concerning the development of programs to extend homeownership opportunities for certain tenants and supplementing P.L.1983, c.530 (C.55:14K-1 et seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. In addition to the powers otherwise granted in P.L.1983, c.530 (C.55:14K-1 et seq.), the ²New Jersey² Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency shall set aside and designate, out of the funds that are or may become available to it for the purpose of assisting the production of affordable housing in the State, certain amounts to be used for ²[the making] assisting in the development of homeownership opportunities 2 [available to] for 2 residents of public housing who seek to acquire ownership of their residential units as part of a resident management corporation, a cooperative corporation or a condominium association formed by the residents of that public housing project through the program established pursuant to Subtitle B of Title IV of P.L.101-625 (42 U.S.C. §12871 et seq.) or any other program administered by the federal government for extending homeownership opportunities to residents of public housing. ²Nothing in this act shall, in any way, relieve a housing authority of the need to submit a plan for replacement housing, as required under 24 CFR 970.11.2

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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Directs HMFA to develop programs to extend homeownership opportunities for public housing residents.

The Assembly Housing Committee reports Assembly Bill No. 1305 favorably, with amendments.

This bill directs the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA) to develop assistance programs for the residents of public housing projects who, as participants in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's "Homeownership and Opportunity for People Everywhere" (HOPE) program or any similar federal program, seek to acquire ownership of their residential unit.

The committee adopted a stylistic amendment, intended to correct an awkward turn of phrase in the bill as drafted, but with no alteration of substance.

The Senate Community Affairs Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1305(1R) with Senate committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 1305(1R), as amended by the committee, directs the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA) to develop assistance programs for the residents of public housing projects who, as participants in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's "Homeownership and Opportunity for People Everywhere" (HOPE) program or any similar federal program, seek to acquire ownership of their residential unit.

Nothing in this act is intended to relieve a housing authority of submitting a plan for replacement housing, as required pursuant to federal regulation.

The HMFA indicates that it can absorb the additional responsibilities imposed under this bill with current agency resources, according to a fiscal estimate prepared on this bill by the Office of Legislative Services.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the bill is not meant to affect the requirement that a housing authority submit a plan for replacement housing to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, as required under federal regulation. The amendment also corrected the reference to the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 990 Sca, which was also reported by this committee on October 22, 1992.

Assembly Bill No. 1305(1R) directs the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA) to develop assistance programs for the residents of public housing projects who, as participants in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's "Homeownership and Opportunity for People Everywhere" (HOPE) program or any similar federal program, seek to acquire ownership of their residential unit.

The New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA) indicates that it can absorb the additional responsibilities imposed under this bill in house with its current programs and with its current agency resources, and therefore no additional HMFA cost would be incurred.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) concurs.
