AN ACT establishing an application fee for certain examinations
 and supplementing Title 11A of the New Jersey Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

6 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall 7 establish a \$5 fee for each application for an open competitive or 8 promotional examination. Persons receiving public assistance benefits pursuant to P.L.1947, c.156 (C.44:8-107 et seq.), 9 P.L.1959, c.86 (C.44:10-1 et seq.), or P.L.1973, c.256 (C.44:7-85 10 et seq.) shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an 11 open competitive examination. 12 Receipts derived from 13 application fees shall be appropriated to the department.

The Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall
 promulgate, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act,"
 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations to
 effectuate the purposes of this act.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

23 This bill provides that the Commissioner of the Department of 24 Personnel shall establish a \$5 fee for each application for an open 25 competitive or promotional examination. Persons receiving public assistance benefits, Aid to Families with Dependent 26 27 Children, or Supplemental Security Income shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive 28 29 examination. The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2010.

Assembly Bill No. 2010 provides that the Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall establish a \$5 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination. Persons receiving public assistance benefits, Aid to Families with Dependent Children, or Supplemental Security Income shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive examination. Receipts derived from application fees shall be appropriated to the department.

FISCAL IMPACT:

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According to data in the Governor's FY'93 Budget Message, the Department of Personnel estimated 160,000 applications were expected for open competitive examinations. If an estimated 10% of the applicants are exempt under the bill's provisions then \$720,000 would be available. Also, the budget message estimated 33,600 promotional exam applicants were expected, whereby raising an additional \$168,000 for a total of approximately \$888,000 to be available for the department. The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2010.

Assembly Bill No. 2010 provides that the Commissioner of the Department of Personnel shall establish a \$5 fee for each application for an open competitive or promotional examination. Persons receiving public assistance benefits, Aid to Families with Dependent Children, or Supplemental Security Income shall not be required to pay this fee if they apply for an open competitive examination. Receipts derived from application fees are appropriated to the department.

FISCAL IMPACT

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Pursuant to this bill, approximately \$444,000 could become available to the department in FY 1993 and \$888,000 in FY 1994, based on the estimates of the Department of Personnel.

According to data in the Governor's FY 1993 Budget Message, the Department of Personnel estimated that there would be 160,000 applications for open competitive examinations during FY 1993. If this bill is signed into law on December 31, 1992, \$360,000 would be generated by June 30, 1992, assuming 80,000 applications will be submitted during the remaining six months of FY 1993 and 10% of the applicants will be exempt from the fee under the bill's provisions

For FY 1994, \$720,000 would be generated for the department by this fee, assuming the department's estimate of 160,000 applications remains constant and 10% of the applicants would be exempt.

In addition, the Governor's budget message estimated that there would be 33,600 promotional exam applications during FY 1993. If this bill is signed into law on December 31, 1992, \$84,000 would be generated by June 30, 1993, assuming 16,800 applications for promotional examinations will be submitted during the remaining six months of FY 1993.

For FY 1994, \$168,000 would be generated for the department's use by this fee on promotional exam applications, assuming the department's estimate of 33,600 applications remains constant.
