AN ACT concerning the hours of operation of casinos and amending P.L.1977, c.110.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Section 97 of P.L.1977. c.110 (C.5:12-97) is amended to read as follows:

97. Hours of Operation. a. No casino licensed pursuant to this act shall operate between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and State and federal holidays, or between the hours of 4 a.m. and 10 a.m. on all other days, except that [for a period of three years following the effective date of this amendatory and supplementary act, P.L.1991, c.182,] the commission may extend the hours of operation, up to and including 24 hours of operation, on any Saturday, Sunday, or State or federal holiday, or on any day [on which the commission determines that there is an event to be held in a casino or in Atlantic City that will have a substantial citywide impact with respect to the number of visitors to the city and will] that an extension of operating hours would, in the judgment of the commission, have an economic impact on the casino industry and on Atlantic City which would justify the extension of those In making this finding, the commission shall consider. among other factors: (1) the anticipated volume of visitor, convention, or tourist traffic in Atlantic City as a result of any scheduled meetings or events; (2) any special promotions or market expansion programs undertaken by the casino industry or others to increase such traffic; or (3) any other basis for the conclusion that an extension of operating hours would, under the circumstances, effect a significant impact on the volume of casino business and thereby on the State revenues dependent thereupon. Any resolution approving an extension of operating hours shall be considered at a regularly scheduled meeting of the commission held pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act." P.L.1975. c.231 (C.10:4-6 et seq.).

- b. A casino licensee shall file with the commission a schedule of hours prior to the issuance of an initial operation certificate. If the casino licensee proposes any change in scheduled hours, such change may not be effected until such licensee files a notice of the new schedule of hours with the commission. Such filing must be made 30 days prior to the effective date of the proposed change in hours.
- c. Nothing herein shall be construed to limit a casino licensee in opening its casino later than, or closing its casino earlier than, the times stated in its schedule of operating hours; provided,

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill concerns the authority granted to the Casino Control Commission under S-652 (1R) of 1992 and A-1233 (1R) of 1992 to authorize 24-hour operation of casinus on any day other than Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday. The purpose of the bill is to give legislative guidelines to the Casino Control Commission in making its decisions on authorizing such 24-hour operation in order to ensure that 24-hour operation every day of the week does not become automatic.

Specifically the bill:

- (1) effects the change in the Casino Control Act, P.L.1977, c.110 (C.5:12-1 et seq.), contained in S-652 (1R) of 1992 and A-1233 (1R) of 1992 with respect to casinos' hours of operation, except that the bill requires that the basis of judgment to be used by the Casino Control Commission in making its finding to authorize 24-hour casino operation on any day other than Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday must be the economic impact on the casino industry and on Atlantic City, rather than on the casino industry or on Atlantic City;
- (2) directs the commission to consider, among other factors:
 (a) the anticipated volume of visitor, convention, or tourist traffic in Atlantic City as a result of any scheduled meetings or events; (b) any special promotions or market expansion programs undertaken by the casino industry or others to increase such traffic; or (c) any other basis for the conclusion that an extension of operating hours would, under the circumstances, effect a significant impact on the volume of casino business and thereby on the State revenues dependent thereupon; and
- (3) requires any resolution approving an extension of operating hours to be considered at a regularly scheduled meeting held pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act." P.L.1975, c.231 (C.10:4-6 et seq.), which requirement is a restatement of the requirement already in the Casino Control Act that the commission comply with the "Open Public Meetings Act" in order to assure that this decision is made in the open.

The Assembly Financial Institutions Committee favorably reports Assembly, No. 1419.

Specifically the bill:

- (1) requires that the basis of judgment to be used by the Casino Control Commission in making its finding to authorize 24-hour casino operation on any day other than Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday must be the economic impact on the casino industry <u>and</u> on Atlantic City, rather than on the casino industry <u>or</u> on Atlantic City, as in current law;
- (2) directs the commission to consider at least the following criteria when making a decision regarding operating hours: (a) the anticipated volume of visitor, convention, or tourist traffic in Atlantic City as a result of any scheduled meetings or events; (b) any special promotions or market expansion programs undertaken by the casino industry or others to increase such traffic; or (c) any other basis for the conclusion that an extension of operating hours would, under the circumstances, have a significant impact on the volume of casino business and thereby on the State revenues dependent thereupon; and
