BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- a. The incidence of child abuse continues to increase in this State and in the nation, and is a serious concern because it affects not only children but their families and community as well; and
- b. While there were over 1 [26,000] $\underline{54,000}^{1}$ cases of suspected child abuse reported in New Jersey in 1 [1983 and over 44,000 cases reported in 1984, an increase of 68% from the previous year] $\underline{1990}^{1}$, many more cases go undetected; and
- c. Although State government has increased its support of programs to identify and treat child abuse, there remains a tremendous need for community based programs which focus on the prevention of child abuse; and
- d. Research has demonstrated that child abuse is not limited to any particular economic or social group, and greater community awareness and broad-based support of child abuse prevention programs will help ensure their success.
- 2. The month of April is permanently designated and declared "Child Abuse Awareness Month" in the State of New Jersey.
- 3. The Governor and the Legislature urge parents, families and community organizations to recognize "Child Abuse Awareness Month" by increasing awareness of the problem of child abuse and emphasizing activities and programs which prevent child abuse.
 - 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Permanently designates April as "Child Abuse Awareness Month."

STATEMENT

This bill permanently designates the month of April as "Child Abuse Awareness Month." The bill is in keeping with the public awareness campaign which was launched by the Department of Human Services late in 1985 and is designed to reduce the number of child abuse cases in New Jersey by 20% over the next year. The campaign features new public service announcements, a proclamation signed by the Governor declaring "Protect A Kid Day" and a toll-free telephone number for New Jersey residents to get information about the problem.

This bill predates the new public awareness campaign and is intended to be a permanent reminder to the citizens of the State of the need for continuing attention to the problem of child abuse.

This bill at the request of the sponsor includes more recent figures on the number of reported child abuse cases in New Jersey, as supplied by the Department of Human Services, to reflect the growing magnitude of the problem and to dramatize the need for greater community awareness and support of child abuse prevention programs which this bill is intended to promote.

Permanently designates April as "Child Abuse Awareness Month."
