1 AN ACT concerning tuition waivers for unemployed workers at 2 certain public institutions of higher education and amending 3 P.L.1983, c.469 and P.L.1983, c.470.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.469 (C.18A:64-13.1) is amended to read as follows:
  - 1. As used in this act:
  - a. "Job training course" means any course of instruction which will provide the individual with an identifiable job skill and will assist [him] the individual in gaining reemployment, any course of instruction which is part of a training program approved pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of subsection (c) of R.S.43:21-4, or any course of instruction which is part of the education and training described in the Employability Development Plan developed for the individual pursuant to section 3 of P.L., c. (C. )(now pending before the Legislature as Assembly Bill No. of 1992).
  - b. "Public [college"] <u>institution of higher education"</u> means the State colleges and the New Jersey Institute of Technology and all other institutions indicated by N.J.S.18A:62-1, except for county colleges.

- 25 2. Section 2 of P.L.1983, c.469 (C.18A:64-13.2) is amended to read as follows:
  - 2. Each public [college] institution of higher education shall permit a person who has been in the labor market for at least two years and is unemployed or has received a layoff notice as a result of a factory or plant closing to enroll without payment of tuition in a job training course, provided that [he] the person is not eligible for any available State or federal student financial aid <sup>1</sup>[or aid available to the person pursuant to job training programs, including P.L.1983, c.328 (C.34:15B-11 et seq.), the "1992 New Jersey Employment and Workforce Development Act," P.L. , c. (C. )(now pending before the Legislature as Assembly Bill No. 1402 of 1992) or the "Job Training Partnership Act," Pub.L.97-300 (29 U.S.C. §1501 et seq.), l¹ and that available classroom space permits and that tuition paying students constitute the minimum number required for the course. Nothing herein shall preclude a county college from requiring a registration fee not to exceed \$20.00 per academic term.

5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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#### **STATEMENT**

 This bill extends the existing tuition waiver program for unemployed workers enrolled in job training courses by making the waivers available for job training courses at all public institutions of higher education. The current laws, P.L.1983, c.469 (C.18A:64-13.1 et seq.) and P.L.1983, c.470 (C.18A:64A-23.1 et seq.), provide the waivers only for job training courses at county colleges, State colleges and the New Jersey Institute of Technology.

The bill also makes the waivers available for any course which is part of an overall job training program approved for an unemployed worker by the State Department of Labor, including courses providing remedial basic skills education deemed necessary for the worker to succeed in occupation training. The present law limits the waivers to courses providing specific job skills.

This legislation would not impose any new costs on public institutions of higher education, because the tuition waivers only

apply, both under the present law and this bill, to courses which have both the minimum required number of paying students and available space for non-paying students. In addition, the bill clarifies that the law's present requirement that no waiver be given to a worker who is eligible for available federal and State student financial aid also prohibits a waiver for a worker for whom aid is available from federal and State job training programs.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JUNE 10, 1992

The Assembly Labor Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1404 with committee amendments.

As amended by the committee, the bill extends the existing tuition waiver program for unemployed workers enrolled in job training courses by making the waivers available for job training courses at all public institutions of higher education. The current laws, P.L.1983, c.469 (C.18A:64-13.1 et seq.) and P.L.1983, c.470 (C.18A:64A-23.1 et seq.), provide the waivers only for job training courses at county colleges, State colleges and the New Jersey Institute of Technology.

The bill also makes the waivers available for any course which is part of an overall job training program approved for an unemployed worker by the State Department of Labor, including courses providing remedial basic skills education deemed necessary for the worker to succeed in occupation training. The present law limits the waivers to courses providing specific job skills.

This legislation would not impose any new costs on public institutions of higher education, because the tuition waivers only apply, both under the present law and this bill, to courses which have both the minimum required number of paying students and available space for non-paying students.

The committee amendments remove a provision that no waiver be given to a worker who is eligible for aid from federal and State job training programs.
