STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MARCH 30, 1982

By Senators CAPIERO and Brown

1 **AN ACT** concerning birth certificates and amending R.S.26:8-28.

2

3 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the
4 **State of New Jersey:**

5 1. R.S.26:8-28 is amended to read as follows:

6 26:8-28. a. Within five days after each birth, there shall be
7 filed with the local registrar of the district in which the birth
8 occurred a certificate of the birth filled out with durable black or
9 blue ink in a legible manner.

10 b. In accordance with the provisions of the federal "Family
11 Support Act of 1988," Pub.L.100-485, the local registrar shall
12 record the Social Security numbers of both parents on a separate
13 form provided or approved by the State registrar pursuant to
14 subsection c. of R.S.26:8-24, and the State registrar shall
15 transmit those numbers to the State IV-D agency for the
16 enforcement of child support orders in effect in the State. For
17 the purposes of this subsection, "State IV-D agency" means the
18 agency in the Department of Human Services designated to
19 administer the Title IV-D Child Support Program.

20 c. The State registrar shall require each parent to provide his
21 Social Security number in accordance with procedures established
22 by the State registrar. The Social Security numbers furnished
23 pursuant to this section shall be used exclusively for child support
24 enforcement purposes.

25 d. The certificate of birth shall include the blood type of the
26 child.

28 2. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after enactment.

The Senate Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 646.

This bill requires that a birth certificate filed with a local registrar pursuant to R.S.26:8-28 include the blood type of the child.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 1257 (Gibson/Colburn) which is pending before the General Assembly.
