BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.26:8-28 is amended to read as follows:

26:8-28. a. Within five days after each birth, there shall be filed with the local registrar of the district in which the birth occurred a certificate of the birth filled out with durable black or blue ink in a legible manner.

b. In accordance with the provisions of the federal "Family 10 Support Act of 1988," Pub.L.100-485, the local registrar shall 11 record the Social Security numbers of both parents on a separate 12 13 form provided or approved by the State registrar pursuant to subsection c. of R.S.26:8-24, and the State registrar shall 14 transmit those numbers to the State IV-D agency for the 15 enforcement of child support orders in effect in the State. For 16 the purposes of this subsection, "State IV-D agency" means the 17 agency in the Department of Human Services designated to 18 administer the Title IV-D Child Support Program. 19

20 c. The State registrar shall require each parent to provide his 21 Social Security number in accordance with procedures established 22 by the State registrar. The Social Security numbers furnished 23 pursuant to this section shall be used exclusively for child support 24 enforcement purposes.

25 <u>d. The certificate of birth shall include the blood type of the</u> 26 <u>child.</u>

2. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after enactment.
