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P.L. 1991. CHAPTER 39, approved February 25, 1991 1990 Assembly No. 2929

AN ACT concerning the transfer of a certain veterans assistance program from one principal department to another and amending R.S.38:20-3.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.38:20-3 is amended to read as follows:

38:20-3. Application for such benefits shall be made to the Department of [Conservation and Economic Development] <u>Military and Veterans' Affairs</u>, which shall make rules and regulations to effectuate the provisions thereof. It shall ascertain and approve the educational aptitude of the applicant for the course of study desired to be pursued in accordance with tests or standards prescribed or approved by the State Department of Education and the financial need of the applicant and may satisfy itself of the attendance of such applicants and the accuracy of the charges made by the institution which the applicant attends. No more than [4] four annual allotments of \$500.00 each shall be allowed any such applicant.

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to transfer authority for the administration of the Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants -program from the Department of Human Services to the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs.

Before the establishment of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, the Department of Human Services administered this program as well as most other veterans' programs. With the enactment of P.L. 1987, c.444 in January of 1988, the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs took over the administration of most veterans programs including this program, even though the transfer of this program was not specifically provided for in that legislation. This bill provides that specific transfer of authority to the department to administer the program.



The Assembly Veterans and Military Affairs Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2929.

The purpose of this bill is to transfer authority for the administration of the Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants program from the Department of Human Services to the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs.

In 1952, the administration of this program was given to the Department of Conservation and Economic Development. In 1970, that department was reorganized, continued and designated as the Department of Environmental Protection and veterans' programs were transferred to the Department of Institutions and Agencies, the predecessor to the present Department of Human Services. With the enactment of P.L.1987, c.444 in January of 1988, the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs took over the administration of most veterans programs including the Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants program, even though the transfer of this program was not specifically provided for in that legislation. This bill provides that specific transfer of authority to the department to administer the program.

The Veterans' Educational Grants program, which became law in 1930, provides annual grants of \$500 to any child between the ages of 16 and 21 years whose parent was a resident of the State who was killed in action or who died while a member of the Armed Forces of the United States during time of war or emergency or who was officially listed as "Missing in Action" or who died of disease or disability resulting from such war or emergency service. Each qualified war orphan is eligible for no more than four annual grants. This money must be used to defray the cost of attending a technical or professional school of a secondary or college grade, approved by the State Board of Education and located in this State. Between FY 1987 and FY 1990, 31 persons participated in this program.

The Senate State Government and Federal and Interstate Relations Committee reports favorably Assembly, No. 2929.

This bill provides the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs with the authority to administer the Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants program.

Before the establishment of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, the Department of Conservation and Economic Development and then the Department of Human Services administered this program. With the enactment of P.L.1987, c.444 in January of 1988, the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs took over the administration of most veterans programs including the Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants program, even though the transfer of this program was not specifically provided for in that act. This bill provides the department with a specific grant of authority to administer the program.

The Veterans' Orphans Educational Grants program provides annual grants of \$500 to any child between 16 and 21 years of age whose parent was a resident of the State and who was killed in action or died from other causes while a member of the armed forces during time of war or emergency, or who is officially listed as "Missing in Action," or who died of a disease or disability resulting from war or emergency service. Each qualified orphan is eligible for no more than four annual grants. The money must be used to defray the cost of attending a technical or professional school of a secondary or college grade. Between FY 1987 and FY 1990, 31 persons participated in this program.
