VIETNAM VETS TO BE HONORED IN SPECIAL LIBERTY PARK CEREMONY

Plans for a special ceremony marking "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Day" at Liberty State Park were announced today by Governor Jim Florio, who also signed legislation setting aside May 7 as an annual commemoration.

"I'm proud that New Jersey isn't forgetting those who didn't get a proper and decent welcome home: our Vietnam Veterans. This is a proud day for all of us here. A proud day for all Americans. It's a time when we can finally say that Vietnam Veterans are getting the recognition and respect they deserve," said Governor Florio. "On May 7, we will host a special ceremony at Liberty State Park and bells will be rung in cities and towns all across our state in honor of the brave men and women who served in Vietnam. It's going to be an important day."

The bill, S 2603/A3327, sponsored by Senator Edward O'Connor, and Assemblymen Fred Scerni and Neil Cohen, designates May 7 annually as "Vietnam Veterans' Remembrance Day." This year, a commemorative ceremony will be held at 2 p.m., in Liberty State Park. The ceremony is expected to feature music, entertainment, speakers and exhibits. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Commission, which is responsible for planning and constructing the state's Vietnam Veterans' Memorial, will help coordinate the Liberty State Park event, as well as other events, to help raise the \$5 million needed to fund the memorial project.

The Commission has already chosen Telegraph Hill at the Garden State Arts Center in Holmdel as the site of the memorial. The memorial will be an open-air circular pavilion consisting of 366 black grantie panels — one for each day of the year. The names of those listed as killed in action or missing in action for each day will appear on the correlating panel.

"This year, we in America proved that we learned our lesson from Vietnam. The people who went to fight in the Persian Gulf got our support and that made their job easier," Governor Florio said. "We've pledged ourselves to making New Jersey a place worthy of those returning heros. Let's also make it a place worthy of the unsung heros who returned before them."
