# [THIRD REPRINT] ASSEMBLY, No. 2530

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### PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1990 SESSION

### By Assemblymen ZANGARI, Baer and Mazur

AN ACT increasing the membership of the Passaic Valley sewerage commissioners, and providing certain requirements for the selection of commissioners, amending R.S.58:14-3 and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes.

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# BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.58:14-3 is amended to read as follows:

58:14-3. The board shall consist of [seven] <sup>1</sup>[eight] nine<sup>1</sup> members who [are residents of the district, not more than four of whom shall be of the same political party] shall be appointed by the Governor in the following manner. Each county in the district shall be represented on the board by two members, of different political parties, both of whom shall reside in the district and in the county they represent. 1At least one of the two members from each county must reside in a contracting municipality as defined in R.S.58:14-34.11 <sup>3</sup>[2or in a leasing municipality<sup>2</sup>]<sup>3</sup> .<sup>1</sup> Not more than <sup>1</sup>[four] five<sup>1</sup> of the <sup>1</sup>[eight] nine<sup>1</sup> members of the board shall be from the same political party. <sup>1</sup>The ninth member shall be an at-large member appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and shall serve during the term of office of the Governor. As used in this section, "at-large member" means a resident of the Passaic Valley Sewerage District as defined in R.S.58:14-1. Upon the expiration of the term of office of a commissioner, his successor shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of 5 years 1, except that the term of the at-large member shall be concurrent with the term of office of the Governor<sup>1</sup>. The Governor may remove any commissioner from office for cause.

Each commissioner shall hold his office until his successor has been appointed, and any vacancy in the membership of the commission because of death, resignation or removal, shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner provided for on original appointment. In making any appointment hereunder, either for a full term or to fill a vacancy, regard shall be had to ability and fitness, and also locality, so that each section of the district may be represented as far as practicable [with at least

AN ACT increasing the membership of the Passaic Valley sewerage commissioners, and providing certain requirements for the selection of commissioners, amending R.S.58:14-3 and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. R.S.58:14-3 is amended to read as follows:

58:14-3. The board shall consist of [seven] eight members who [are residents of the district, not more than four of whom shall be of the same political party] shall be appointed by the Governor in the following manner. Each county in the district shall be represented on the board by two members, of different political parties, both of whom shall reside in the district and in the county they represent. Not more than four of the eight members of the board shall be from the same political party. Upon the expiration of the term of office of a commissioner, his successor shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of 5 years. The Governor may remove any commissioner from office for cause.

Each commissioner shall hold his office until his successor has been appointed, and any vacancy in the membership of the commission because of death, resignation or removal, shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner provided for on original appointment. In making any appointment hereunder, either for a full term or to fill a vacancy, regard shall be had to ability and fitness, and also locality, so that each section of the district may be represented as far as practicable [with at least one member from each county within the district, but not more than two members from the same county].

Not more than four of the eight commissioners would be of the same political party. Section 2 of the bill would enable the current commissioners to continue in their positions until these positions expire; however, any reappointments, and any filling of full or unexpired terms would be done in accordance with R.S.58:14-3, as amended in this bill.

The Assembly Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2530 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill increases the membership of the Passaic Valley sewerage commissioners from seven to nine. In addition, it would provide that each of the four counties comprising the sewerage district, Bergen, Essex, Hudson and Passaic, would have two members on the board. The two members from each county would be of different political parties, and would be residents of the district and of the county they represent. The bill also provides that at least one of the two members representing each county within the district come from a contracting municipality. The ninth member would be an at-large member appointed by the Governor for a term concurrent with that of the Governor. The at-large member must be a resident of the Passaic Valley Sewerage District. Not more than five of the nine commissioners would be of the same political party. Section 2 of the bill would enable the current commissioners to continue in their positions until these positions expire; however, any reappointments, and any filling of full or unexpired terms would be done in accordance with R.S.58:14-3, as amended in this bill.

The committee amendments incorporate recommendations of the Passaic Valley Sewerage district commissioners. These amendments mandate the addition of a ninth commissioner and require that at least one of the two members from each county within the district reside in a contracting municipality. The addition of a ninth commissioner was intended to provide an additional voting member in the event of a tie vote.

The residency requirement is intended to insure that contracting municipalities, i.e., those that originally built the collection system and treatment plant, will always have representation on the commission.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate State Government and Federal and Interstate Relations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2530 [1R].
