AN ACT concerning the Commodities and Services Council in the Department of Human Services and amending and supplementing P.L.1981, c.488.

5 - -

BE-IT-ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. The title of P.L.1981, c.488 is amended to read as follows:

AN ACT establishing a [commodities and services council]

Commodities and Services Council for blind and other severely handicapped persons and supplementing Title 30 of the Revised Statutes.

(cf: P.L.1981, c.488, title)

- 2. Section 2 of P.L.1981, c.488 (C.30:6-24) is amended to read as follows:
 - 2. As used in this act:
- a. "Blind person" means a person whose vision in [his] the better eye with proper correction does not exceed 20/200 or who has a field defect in [his] the better eye with proper correction which contracts the peripheral field so that the diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees.
- b. "Central [nonprofit agency] Nonprofit Agency" means [an] the agency designated by the commissioner pursuant to section 6 of this act.
- c. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Department of Human Services.
- d. "Rehabilitation facility" means a rehabilitation facility [approved by the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services or the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired] located in this State which qualifies as a charitable organization or institution under the provisions of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is conducted on a nonprofit basis for the purpose of carrying out a recognized program of rehabilitation for individuals whose earning capacity is impaired by age or physical or mental deficiency or injury and of providing these individuals with remunerative employment or other occupational rehabilitative activity of an educational or therapeutic nature as defined in section 525.1 et seq. of the regulations adopted pursuant to the federal "Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938," 29

U.S.C. § 201 et seq. and related codes, and which is engaged in the production of commodities or the provision of services in connection with which not less than 75% of the total hours of direct labor is performed by blind or other severely handicapped persons excluding any hours of supervision, administration, inspection or shipping.

e. "Severely handicapped person" means a person with a physical, mental or emotional disability, other than blindness but including a visual impairment, which is a substantial handicap to employment and prevents that person from currently engaging in normal competitive employment.

f. "State agency" means an agency of State government. (cf: P.L.1981, c.488, s.2)

- 3. Section 3 of P.L.1981, c.488 (C.30:6-25) is amended to read as follows:
- 3. There is established in the Department of Human Services, the Commodities and Services Council for blind and other severely handicapped persons. The council shall consist of the Director of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services; the Director of the Division of Purchase and Property; the [chief] Chief of the Bureau of State Use Industries; the [President of the New Jersey Business and Industry Association; the President of the New Jersey AFL-CIO] the Director of the Division of Development for Small Business and Women and Minority Businesses in the Department of Commerce, Energy and Economic Development; the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities in the Department of Human Services; the Executive Director of the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired; the President of the New Jersey Association of Rehabilitation Facilities; or their designees; three citizens as at-large members, at least one of whom shall be a blind person, and at least one of whom shall represent the [general public] private business sector. The at-large members shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, for terms of 3 years, except that of the first at-large members appointed, one shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, one for a term of 2 years, and one for a term of 1 year. (cf: P.L.1981, c.488, s.3)
- 4. Section 5 of P.L.1981, c.488 (C.30:6-27) is amended to read as follows:
 - 5. The duties of the council shall include:
- a. Developing, in conjunction with the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the Treasury] through the Central Nonprofit Agency a list of commodities and services which shall be set aside for purchase through approved rehabilitation facilities and establishing a fair market price for those commodities and services.
 - b. Recommending to the commissioner [a central nonprofit] an

agency to be designated as the Central Nonprofit Agency.

c. Encouraging the purchase of commodities and services of blind and other severely handicapped persons by political subdivisions of the State.

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 921.

This bill changes the membership of the Commodities and Services Council for blind and other severely handicapped persons established pursuant to P.L.1981, c.488 (C.30:6-23 et seq.) to include the Director of the Division of Development for Small Business and Women and Minority Businesses in the Department of Commerce, Energy and Economic Development and the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities in the Department of Human Services. The President of the New Jersey Business and Industry Association and the President of the New Jersey AFL-CIO are deleted as members of the council. The latter two organizations have not demonstrated an interest in the proceedings of the council to date and have indicated no objection to being removed from the council.

In addition, the bill broadens the definition of rehabilitation facility in P.L.1981, c.488 in order to expand eligibility for the set-aside program to include many nonprofit facilities that are currently excluded from the program, and thereby fulfill the intent of the original law to provide training and employment opportunities to persons with disabilities in nonprofit vocational rehabilitation facilities.

The bill provides that P.L.1981, c.488 shall be known henceforth as the "Rehabilitation Facilities Set-Aside Act," and makes other technical changes in the original law.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 3625 of 1989 (Cowan) and Assembly Bill No. 5029 of 1989 (Crecco). Both bills were reported by the Assembly Higher Education and Regulated Professions Committee during the 1988-89 session but did not advance beyond second reading in the Assembly.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 1990-91 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
