P.L.1991, CHAPTER 293, approved September 25, 1991 1991 Assembly No. 4452

AN ACT concerning county special services school districts and amending P.L.1971, c.271.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Section 10 of P.L.1971, c.271 (C.18A:46-38) is amended to read as follows:

10. The board of education provided for herein shall be a body corporate and shall be known as "The Board of Education of the Special Services School District of the county of ," (here insert the name of the county in which such school shall be located). The board shall organize and operate in the manner provided by law and shall have the power to appoint or employ such officers, agents and employees as may be required to carry out the provisions of P.L.1971, c.271 and to fix and determine their qualifications, duties, compensation, terms of office and all other conditions and terms of employment and retention. In addition, the board shall have all the powers as are now or may hereafter be provided by law and applicable for other school districts. subject to the additional restrictions provided by this act.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

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This bill clarifies the Legislature's intent that county special services school districts possess the same powers of employment as county vocational schools and county community colleges. Recently, there have been administrative rulings placing nonprofessional and noninstructional employees of county special services school districts under Title 11A, The Civil Service Act. based on the fact that the statute covering these school districts did not specify broad employment powers for the boards. This bill would clarify the Legislature's intent that county special services districts have employment powers granted under Title 18A, and therefore the provisions of that title govern employment matters of these boards, rather than the provisions of Title 11A.

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EDUCATION

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Clarifies that employment matters of county special services 42 school boards are governed by Title 184 of the New Jersey 43 Statutes.

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 4452.
