PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1990 SESSION

By Assemblymen OTLOWSKI and DUCH

AN ACT concerning the provision of information about certain
 health care practitioners to pharmacists ¹[and supplementing
 chapter 21 of Title 24 of the Revised Statutes]¹.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

¹[1. The Commissioner of Health shall receive and compile 7 8 information on each physician, dentist or veterinarian licensed, registered or otherwise permitted to prescribe or administer a 9 controlled dangerous substance in the course of professional 10 practice whose license to practice has been suspended, revoked, 11 or voluntarily surrendered, or who has been ordered to cease and 12 desist from prescribing or administering certain substances. This 13 information shall include but need not be limited to the name, 14 title, address and license numbers of that person, the nature of 15 the disciplinary action taken, and the effective date of that 16 action.]¹ 17

1[2.] 1.1The State Board of Medical Examiners¹[, in 18 accordance with the requirements of section 1 of P.L., c. 19 (C.) (now pending before the Legislature as this bill),]¹ shall 20 notify ¹[the Commissioner of Health] each pharmacy owner in the 21 <u>State</u>¹ in writing of any physician permitted to prescribe or 22 administer a controlled dangerous substance in the course of 23 professional practice whose license to practice has been 24 suspended, revoked, or voluntarily surrendered, or who has been 25 ordered to cease and desist from prescribing or administering 26 certain substances. ¹The board shall also notify the pharmacy 27 owners when the physician's license to practice or authority to 28 29 prescribe or administer certain substances has been reinstated.

Pursuant to section 4 of P.L. , c. STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 911.

This bill is intended to ensure that every pharmacy owner in this State is notified on a timely basis of any physician, dentist, or veterinarian allowed to prescribe or administer controlled drugs whose license has been suspended, revoked or voluntarily surrendered, or who has been ordered to cease and desist from prescribing or administering certain drugs. The bill requires the Department of Health to receive this information from the appropriate State professional board. The department shall provide this information to the State Board of Pharmacy which shall be responsible for making this information available in writing to each pharmacy owner for the use of any pharmacist employed in the owner's place of business.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990-91 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed. STATEMENT TO

with committee amendments

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MAY 13, 1991

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 911 with committee amendments.

As amended by committee, this bill requires the State Board of Medical Examiners, the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry, and the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, to each notify in writing every pharmacy owner in the State when the license of a practitioner under its respective jurisdiction is suspended, revoked, or voluntarily surrendered, or the practitioner has been ordered to cease and desist from prescribing or administering certain substances. The Board of Pharmacy of the State of New Jersey is directed to provide the respective boards with a list of the names and addresses of all the pharmacy owners in the State.

The committee amended the bill to delete the requirements that the licensing boards report the information about a prescriber to the Department of Health and that the department so notify the Board of Pharmacy. The amendments require, instead, that the respective boards notify the pharmacy owners directly. Other amendments require the licensing boards to also inform the pharmacy owners when the physician, dentist or veterinarian's license or authority to prescribe or administer controlled dangerous substances has been reinstated.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 3229 SCA (Paterniti), which the committee also reported favorably on this date.
