BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

Any municipality may, by ordinance, establish restricted parking zones in front of residences occupied by handicapped persons, who have been issued special vehicle identification cards by the Division of Motor Vehicles pursuant to the provisions of section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205), provided [a. such persons are holders of current drivers' licenses issued by this State; b. the motor vehicles to be parked in such zones are equipped with such special attachments and devices as the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may deem necessary to provide for the safe operation thereof by such persons; and c.] such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.
  - 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### **STATEMENT**

Municipalities are authorized to establish restricted parking zones at the homes of handicapped residents only if those persons are licensed drivers and have vehicles equipped with special devices to provide for safe operation. These requirements preclude a municipality from establishing a restricted parking zone at the home of a handicapped child or other person who may not be a licensed driver or require a specially equipped vehicle. By removing these requirements, this bill is intended to serve the needs of such individuals and their families.

#### MOTOR VEHICLES

The Assembly Municipal Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2941(1R).

Under the current law, section 1 of P.L.1977, c.309 (C.39:4-197.6), a municipality may establish a restricted parking zone in front of the home of a handicapped person if the handicapped person is a licensed driver and the person's vehicle is equipped with special attachments or devices to provide for the safe operation of the vehicle by the handicapped person.

These requirements preclude the establishment of a restricted parking zone in front of the home of a handicapped child or other person who may not be a licensed driver or who does not require a vehicle equipped with special attachments or devices.

This bill amends section 1 of P.L.1977, c.309 (C.39:4-197.6) to remove these requirements and to substitute the requirement that a vehicle owned by a handicapped person or member of that person's family have either a windshield placard or a wheelchair symbol license plate issued for that vehicle pursuant to the handicapped person identification card statute, P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-204 et seq.). The placard or license plates issued under that statute are to be displayed on a motor vehicle used to transport the handicapped person, or when the vehicle is parked overtime or in a special parking space established for use by handicapped persons.

The bill also deletes and replaces the term "special vehicle identification card" since that term was removed from the statutes in 1981 and was replaced by "windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates."

The Senate Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2941 with amendments.

Pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c.309 (C.39:4-197.6), a municipality may establish a restricted parking zone in front of the home of a handicapped person if the handicapped person is a licensed driver and the person's vehicle is equipped with special attachments of devices to provide for the safe operation of the vehicle by the handicapped person.

These requirements preclude the establishment of a restricted parking zone in front of the home of a handicapped child or other person who may not be a licensed driver or who does not require a vehicle equipped with special attachments or devices.

As amended, this bill changes section 1 of P.L.1977, c.309 (C.39:4-197.6) to remove these two requirements and to substitute the requirement that a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued for a vehicle owned by the handicapped person, or by a member of the handicapped persons family under the handicapped person identification card statute, P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-204 et seq.). The placard or license plates issued under that statute are to be displayed on a motor vehicle used to transport the handicapped person, or when the vehicle is parked overtime or in a special parking space established for use by handicapped persons.

The committee amendments delete and replace the term "special vehicle identification card" since that term was removed from the statutes in 1981 and replaced by "windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates."
