#### P.L. 2017, CHAPTER 382, approved January 16, 2018 Assembly, No. 4573 (Third Reprint)

1 An ACT concerning emergency contact information and 2 [supplementing Title 39 of the Revised Statutes] amending P.L.2011, c.47<sup>2</sup>.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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<sup>2</sup>[1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry Act."]<sup>2</sup>

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- 11 [22. a. Motor vehicle manufacturers that are engaged in the business of distributing motor vehicles in this State, in conjunction 12 13 with law enforcement agencies and the National Law Enforcement 14 Telecommunications System, shall establish a National Motor 15 Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry on or before January 1, 2018 which shall be capable of storing emergency contact information to 16 17 be accessible by law enforcement officers for the purposes 18 established in section 3 of P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The registry shall be linked to the "Next-19 20 of-Kin Registry" established pursuant to P.L.2011, c.47 (C.39:4-21 134.2 et  $^{1}[seq] \underline{al}^{1}$ .).
  - b. Every new motor vehicle dealer licensed pursuant to R.S.39:10-19 and every leasing dealer, as defined in section 2 of P.L.1994, c.190 (C.56:12-61), shall allow a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle to voluntarily register at the point of sale an emergency contact to be stored in the registry.
  - c. Information in the registry shall be available for the exclusive use of law enforcement officers. Any emergency contact information contained in the registry shall not be considered a <sup>1</sup>[public] government record pursuant to P.L.1963, c.73 (C.47:1A-1 et seq.), P.L.2001, c.404 (C.47:1A-5 et al.), or the common law concerning access to <sup>1</sup>[public] government records and shall not be discoverable as a <sup>1</sup>[public] government record by any person, entity, or governmental agency, except upon a subpoena issued by a grand jury or a court order in a criminal matter.
- d. The Attorney General shall promulgate guidelines to effectuate the purposes of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

e. For the purposes of P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill):

"Emergency contact" means a person, 18 years of age or older, whom the purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle has designated to be contacted by law enforcement personnel when the purchaser or lessee is rendered unable to communicate due to a motor vehicle crash resulting in serious bodily injury, death, or incapacitation of the purchaser or lessee. An emergency contact may or may not be the next-of-kin of the purchaser or lessee.

"Registry" means the National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry established pursuant to subsection a. of this section. **1**<sup>2</sup>

- <sup>2</sup>[3. a. When a motor vehicle crash results in serious bodily injury, death, or incapacitation of a driver, rendering the driver unable to communicate, the law enforcement officer investigating the motor vehicle crash shall attempt to locate an emergency contact by accessing the registry established pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The law enforcement officer shall, when practicable, expeditiously notify the emergency contact of the driver involved in the motor vehicle crash and inform the emergency contact of the hospital or other location at which the driver may be receiving medical treatment.
- b. A law enforcement officer or law enforcement employee shall not be liable to any person for civil damages, or subject to criminal prosecution resulting from or caused by: (1) any disruption or failure in Internet service caused by any accident, malfunction, act of sabotage or God, or any other condition or circumstance that the law enforcement agency, directly or indirectly, caused and which results in, or prevents the law enforcement officers from, accessing the registry; (2) inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry; or (3) the inability of any law enforcement officer to make contact, in good faith, with any designated emergency contact person. The Transportation and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 4573.

As amended and reported, this bill requires motor vehicle manufacturers that are engaged in the business of distributing vehicles in this State, in conjunction with law enforcement agencies and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System, to establish the "National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry" ("registry"). The registry is to be capable of storing emergency contact information to be accessible by law enforcement officers. The registry is to be linked with the State's "Next-of-Kin Registry."

Under the bill, every new motor vehicle dealer and leasing dealer is required to allow a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle to voluntarily register at the point of sale an emergency contact to be stored in the registry. The information is to be available for the exclusive use of law enforcement and is not to be considered a government record for purposes of the State's open public record laws.

The bill provides that when a motor vehicle crash results in serious bodily injury, death, or incapacitation of a driver, rendering the driver unable to communicate, the law enforcement officer investigating the motor vehicle crash is required to attempt to locate an emergency contact by accessing the registry. The officer is also required, when practicable, to notify the emergency contact of the driver involved in the crash and inform the emergency contact of the hospital or other location at which the driver may be receiving medical treatment.

A law enforcement officer is immune from civil and criminal liability resulting from: 1) any disruption or failure in Internet service which results in or prevents the officer from accessing the registry; 2) inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry; or 3) the inability of the officer to make contact, in good faith, with any designated emergency contact person.

The bill also provides that a motor vehicle manufacturer, a new motor vehicle dealer, or a leasing dealer is immune from civil or criminal liability resulting from inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry or any disruption or failure of the system.

The provisions of this bill apply to motor vehicles that are a 2020 model year or later and that are sold or leased on or after January 1, 2019.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

The committee amended the synopsis of the bill to read: "Requires motor vehicle manufacturers doing business in New Jersey to establish motor vehicle emergency contract registry." The committee also amended the bill to change the term "public record" to "government record" throughout the bill and to correct a statutory citation.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: DECEMBER 4, 2017

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4573 (1R), with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill requires the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to allow a holder of any New Jersey State validated permit or probationary or basic driver's license to include, with the submission of the name and telephone number of two emergency contacts, the vehicle identification number of any vehicle owned, leased, or authorized to be used by the permit holder or licensee to the "Next-of-Kin Registry" (registry) either through the MVC website or by mail.

The bill requires that a permit holder or licensee is to have the opportunity to update the vehicle identification number information provided to the registry at any time.

As amended and reported, this bill is identical to the Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 2966, as reported by the committee.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The amendments eliminate provisions of the bill that required certain motor vehicle manufacturers to establish a National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry, and required every new motor vehicle dealer and leasing dealer to allow a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle to voluntarily register an emergency contact to be stored in the National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry.

The amendments instead require the MVC to allow a holder of any permit or driver's license to include, with the submission of two emergency contacts, the vehicle identification number of any vehicle owned, leased, or authorized to be used by the permit holder or licensee to the State's "Next-of-Kin Registry" either through the MVC's website or by mail.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Office of Legislative Service does not have sufficient information about the nature of the programming changes required to

be made to the MVC website for the "Next-Of-Kin Registry" to determine the fiscal impact of the bill. When similar changes have been made to commission-wide MVC software in the past, the MVC has indicated that it typically faces approximately \$50,000 in costs from the information technology contractors to make programming changes to the existing software. Depending upon the complexity of these changes, the MVC may face a similar or greater cost to implement these changes to the website component of the "Next-Of-Kin Registry."

7 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "National 8 Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry Act."

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- 10 Motor vehicle manufacturers that are engaged in the 11 business of distributing motor vehicles in this State, in conjunction 12 with law enforcement agencies and the National Law Enforcement 13 Telecommunications System, shall establish a National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry on or before January 1, 2018 14 15 which shall be capable of storing emergency contact information to 16 be accessible by law enforcement officers for the purposes 17 established in section 3 of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The registry shall be linked to the "Next-18 19 of-Kin Registry" established pursuant to P.L.2011, c.47 (C.39:4-
- 20 134.2 et seq.).
- b. Every new motor vehicle dealer licensed pursuant to R.S.39:10-19 and every leasing dealer, as defined in section 2 of P.L.1994, c.190 (C.56:12-61), shall allow a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle to voluntarily register at the point of sale an emergency contact to be stored in the registry.
- 26 Information in the registry shall be available for the 27 exclusive use of law enforcement officers. Any emergency contact 28 information contained in the registry shall not be considered a 29 public record pursuant to P.L.1963, c.73 (C.47:1A-1 et seq.), 30 P.L.2001, c.404 (C.47:1A-5 et al.), or the common law concerning 31 access to public records and shall not be discoverable as a public record by any person, entity, or governmental agency, except upon 32 33 a subpoena issued by a grand jury or a court order in a criminal 34 matter.
- d. The Attorney General shall promulgate guidelines to effectuate the purposes of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).
- e. For the purposes of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill):
- "Emergency contact" means a person, 18 years of age or older, whom the purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle has designated to be contacted by law enforcement personnel when the purchaser or lessee is rendered unable to communicate due to a motor vehicle crash resulting in serious bodily injury, death, or

incapacitation of the purchaser or lessee. An emergency contact may or may not be the next-of-kin of the purchaser or lessee.

"Registry" means the National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry established pursuant to subsection a. of this section.

- 3. a. When a motor vehicle crash results in serious bodily injury, death, or incapacitation of a driver, rendering the driver unable to communicate, the law enforcement officer investigating the motor vehicle crash shall attempt to locate an emergency contact by accessing the registry established pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The law enforcement officer shall, when practicable, expeditiously notify the emergency contact of the driver involved in the motor vehicle crash and inform the emergency contact of the hospital or other location at which the driver may be receiving medical treatment.
- b. A law enforcement officer or law enforcement employee shall not be liable to any person for civil damages, or subject to criminal prosecution resulting from or caused by: (1) any disruption or failure in Internet service caused by any accident, malfunction, act of sabotage or God, or any other condition or circumstance that the law enforcement agency, directly or indirectly, caused and which results in, or prevents the law enforcement officers from, accessing the registry; (2) inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry; or (3) the inability of any law enforcement officer to make contact, in good faith, with any designated emergency contact person. This limitation of liability is inapplicable if the failure resulted from a malicious purpose or a wanton and willful disregard for the safety of persons or property.

- 4. a. Every new motor vehicle dealer and leasing dealer shall make a good faith effort to register accurate information in the registry as provided by the purchaser or lessee at the point of sale.
- b. A motor vehicle manufacturer, a new motor vehicle dealer, or a leasing dealer shall not be liable for any civil damages or subject to criminal prosecution resulting from inaccurate or outdated information contained in the registry or any disruption or failure of the system. This limitation of liability is inapplicable if the failure resulted from a malicious purpose or a wanton and willful disregard for the safety of persons or property.

5. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to motor vehicles that are a 2020 model year or later and that are sold or leased on or after January 1, 2019.

#### STATEMENT

This bill requires motor vehicle manufacturers that are engaged in the business of distributing vehicles in this State, in conjunction with law enforcement agencies and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System, to establish the "National Motor Vehicle Emergency Contact Registry" (NMVECR). The registry is to be capable of storing emergency contact information to be accessible by law enforcement officers.

Under the bill, every new motor vehicle dealer and leasing dealer is required to allow a purchaser or lessee of a new motor vehicle to voluntarily register at the point of sale an emergency contact to be stored in the NMVECR. The information is to be available for the exclusive use of law enforcement and is not to be considered a public record.

The bill provides that when a motor vehicle crash results in serious bodily injury, death, or incapacitation of a driver, rendering the driver unable to communicate, the law enforcement officer investigating the motor vehicle crash is required to attempt to locate an emergency contact by accessing the registry. The officer is also required, when practicable, to notify the emergency contact of the driver involved in the crash and inform the emergency contact of the hospital or other location at which the driver may be receiving medical treatment.

A law enforcement officer is immune from civil and criminal liability resulting from: 1) any disruption or failure in Internet service which results in or prevents the officer from accessing the registry; 2) inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry; or 3) the inability of the officer to make contact, in good faith, with any designated emergency contact person.

The bill also provides that a motor vehicle manufacturer, a new motor vehicle dealer, or a leasing dealer is immune from civil or criminal liability resulting from inaccurate or out-dated information contained in the registry or any disruption or failure of the system.

The provisions of this bill apply to motor vehicles that are a 2020 model year or later and that are sold or leased on or after January 1, 2019.

# SENATE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE, No. 2966

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably a Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 2966.

This substitute bill requires the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to allow a holder of any New Jersey State validated permit or probationary or basic driver's license to include, with the submission of the name and telephone number of two emergency contacts, the vehicle identification number of any vehicle owned, leased, or authorized to be used by the permit holder or licensee to the "Next-of-Kin Registry" (registry) either through the MVC's website or by mail.

The substitute requires that a permit holder or licensee is to have the opportunity to update the vehicle identification number information in the registry at any time.

As reported, this substitute is identical to Assembly Bill No. 4573 (1R), as amended and reported by the committee.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Office of Legislative Service does not have sufficient information about the nature of the programming changes required to be made to the MVC website for the "Next-Of-Kin Registry" to determine the fiscal impact of the substitute. When similar changes have been made to commission-wide MVC software in the past, the MVC has indicated that it typically faces approximately \$50,000 in costs from the information technology contractors to make programming changes to the existing software. Depending upon the complexity of these changes, the MVC may face a similar or greater cost to implement these changes to the website component of the "Next-Of-Kin Registry."

These Senate Amendments delay the implementation of the bill from first day of the seventh month after enactment to the first day of the 13th month after enactment and clarify that the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission may take anticipatory administrative action as may be necessary for the timely implementation of the bill.
