counties and amending N.J.S. 2A:2-1.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
5 State of New Jersey:

1. N.J.S. 2A:2-1 is amended to read as follows:

2A:2-1 a. The Superior Court shall consist of not less than
[349] 351 judges. Each judge shall receive such annual salary as
9 shall be fixed by law.

b. (1) The Superior Court shall at all times consist of the

their appointment and reappointment were residents of that

The Senate Judiciary Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1380.

This bill would authorize two additional Superior Court judgeships for Hudson County. Hudson County presently has twenty authorized judgeships.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1988 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
