INTRODUCED JANUARY 23, 1967

AN ACT to enable the Commissioner of Transportation to acquire uneconomic remnants of lands and rights therein and supplementing chapter 7 of Title 27 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

3 1. In addition to the powers now vested in the Commissioner of
4 Transportation for the acquisition of lands or rights therein by
5 virtue of any statute, the commissioner may, in his discretion,
6 acquire by gift, devise, purchase or condemnation, an entire lot,
7 block or tract of land, if, by so doing, the interests of the public
8 will be best served even though said entire lot, block or tract is not
9 needed for the right-of-way proper but only if the portion outside
10 the normal right-of-way is landlocked or is so situated that the cost
11 of acquisition to the State will be practically equivalent to the total
12 value of the whole parcel of land; provided, however, that the com-
13 missioner shall not have the power to acquire by the exercise of the
14 right of eminent domain for any of the purposes of this act any
15 property or property rights owned or used by any public utility as
16 defined in section 48:2-13 of the Revised Statutes.

17 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
