INTRODUCED DECEMBER 7, 1981

AN ACT concerning the courts, authorizing the appointment of certain personnel and amending N. J. S. 2A:2-7.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. N. J. S. 2A:2-7 is amended to read as follows:

2 2A:2-7. The Supreme Court shall appoint, to serve at its
3 pleasure, and shall fix the salaries of **[two]** a deputy **[clerks]** *clerk*
4 of the Superior Court, **[one of whom shall be]** a clerk of the
5 Appellate Division of the Superior Court and *a deputy clerk of the*
6 *Appellate Division of the Superior Court*, each of whom shall not
7 be subject to the provisions of Title 11, Civil Service, of the Revised
8 Statutes. The clerk of the Superior Court shall select and employ
9 such other necessary assistants for his office in accordance with
10 the provisions of Title 11 of the Revised Statutes.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

Presently, the Supreme Court shall appoint, outside the scope of Title 11, Civil Service, of the Revised Statutes, two deputy clerks of the Superior Court, one of whom is clerk of the Appellate Division.

The growing complexities and volume of the work of the Superior Court Appellate Division require that the deputy clerk thereof who works directly with the clerk of that court be an attorney who has experience in administrative matters of the court. There is very little possibility of obtaining or promoting a person with these qualifications pursuant to the Civil Service procedures. The deputy clerk of the Supreme Court, as well as the deputy clerk of the Superior Court, are now in the unclassified service. This bill provides that the deputy clerk of the Appellate Division shall be appointed outside the scope of Title 11 as well.
