1 AN ACT concerning motor oil, and amending P.L.1987, c.102.

3 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
4 State of New Jersey:

5 1. Section 43 of P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.35) is amended to
6 read as follows:

7 43. a. On or after July 1, 1987, no person shall sell, or offer
8 for sale, at retail or at wholesale for direct retail sale in this
9 State any motor oil in containers for use off the premises unless:

10 (1) Every container of lubricating or other oil is clearly
11 marked or labeled as containing a recyclable material which shall
12 be disposed of after use only at a used oil collection center; and

13 (2) The motor oil retailer shall conspicuously post and
14 maintain, at or near the point of sale, a durable and legible
15 [metal] sign, not less than 11 inches by 15 inches in size
16 informing the public of the importance of the proper collection
17 and disposal of used oil, and how and where used oil may be
18 properly disposed. For the purposes of this section, "motor oil
19 retailer" means any person who sells to consumers more than 500
20 gallons of lubricating or other oil annually in containers for use
21 off the premises where sold.

22 b. The Commissioner of the Department of Environmental
23 Protection shall adopt, pursuant to the provisions of the
24 "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et
25 seq.) any rules and regulations necessary to implement the
26 provisions of this section.

28 2. Section 44 of P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.36) is amended to
29 read as follows:

30 44. a. On or after July 1, 1987, every owner or operator of a
31 used oil collection center shall post and maintain a durable and
32 legible [metal] sign, not less than 11 inches by 15 inches in size,
33 in a prominent location, informing the public that it is a
34 collection site for the disposal of used oil. For the purposes of
35 this section, "used oil collection center" means any reinspection
36 station permitted by the Division of Motor Vehicles in the
37 Department of Law and Public Safety, or retail service station
38 which has a used oil collection tank on the premises, or any site
39 which accepts used oil for recycling.

40 b. The Commissioner of the Department of Environmental
41 Protection shall adopt, pursuant to the provisions of the
