AN ACT requiring the State Treasurer to publish certain information concerning receipts and expenditures of casino and lottery revenues and amending P. L. 1970, c. 13 and P. L. 1977, c. 110.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
 2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 22 of P. L. 1970, c. 13 (C. 5:9-22) is amended to
 2 read as follows:

3 22. The moneys in said State Lottery Fund shall be appropriated
 4 only (a) for the payment of prizes to the holders of winning lottery
 5 tickets or shares, (b) for the expenses of the division in its opera-
 6 tion of the lottery, (c) for State institutions and State aid for educa-
 7 tion as shall be provided by law, and (d) for the repayment to the
 8 general treasury of the amount appropriated to the fund pursuant
 9 to section 23 of this act. *On or about ***[January 1]*** *March 15*
 10 *and September 15* of each year, the State Treasurer shall publish*
 11 *in at least 10 newspapers circulating generally in the State a report*
 12 *accounting for the total revenues received in the State Lottery*
 13 *Fund and the specific amounts of money appropriated therefrom*
 14 *for specific expenditures during the ***[previous year]*** *preceding*
 15 *six months ending December 31 and June 30*.*

1 2. Section 145 of P. L. 1977, c. 110 (C. 5:12-145) is amended
 2 to read as follows:

3 145. Casino Revenue Fund. a. There is hereby created and
 4 established in the Department of the Treasury a separate special
 5 account to be known as the "Casino Revenue Fund," into which

This bill requires the State Treasurer to publish semiannually in at least 10 newspapers circulating in New Jersey an account of revenues and expenditures in the State Lottery Fund and the Casino Revenue Fund. These accounts would supplement the data provided in the annual budget message and appropriations act to enable a wider taxpayer audience to see the specific allocation of these dedicated revenue funds.

Governor Thomas H. Kean yesterday signed legislation to extend the State's so-called "lemon law" to motorcycles, thus giving motorcycle purchasers the same protection against defects as new car purchasers.

The bill, S-1103, was sponsored by Senator Gerald Cardinale, R-Bergen.

The bill requires the manufacturer of a new motorcycle to repair all defects covered by a written warrenty if reported by the purchaser during the warrenty period or within one year of the vehicle's delivery, whichever is earlier. If the manufacturer is unable to repair a defect which substantially impairs the motorcycle's use, value of safety, he must replace the vehicle or refund the purchase price.

The legislation applies to motorcycles purchased as of yesterday.

The Governor also signed:

A-171, sponsored by Assemblywoman Barbara Kalik, D-Burlington, which requires the State Treasurer to publish in at least 10 newspapers of general circulation the revenues and expenditures from both the lottery fund and the casino revenue fund.

A-1952, sponsored by Assemblyman Wayne Bryant, D-Camden, to authorize the Borough of Somerdale, Camden County, to make permanent the appointment of Ephraim Toy as Police Chief, despite *his* being over the maximum allowable age.
