L. 1942, c. 142), as the title of said act was amended by chapter 237 of the laws of 1952,' approved July 22, 1954 (P. L. 1954, c. 188)," approved November 30, 1959 (P. L. 1959, c. 175).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

3 1. Section 1 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended
4 to read as follows:

5 1. Whenever any employee, included in the act of which this act
6 is a supplement, is absent from his post of duty as a result of a
7 personal injury caused by an accident arising out of and in the
8 course of his employment, his employer **[may]** *shall* pay to such
9 employee **[up to]** the full salary or wages for the period of such
10 absence **[for up to 1 calendar year]** without having such absence
11 charged to the annual sick leave or the accumulated sick leave
12 provided in section 1 of the act of which this act is a supplement.
13 Salary or wage payments provided in this section shall be made
14 for absence during the waiting period and during the period the
15 employee received or was eligible to receive a temporary disability
16 benefit under chapter 15 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes. Any

- 2 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This will amend the teacher sick leave law to provide leave of absence with pay in cases of injuries or illness arising from employment and subject to the Workman's Compensation Act.

At present, whenever a teacher is absent as a result of a personal injury caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, the board of education may pay up to 1 calendar year without having such absence charged to the annual or accumulated sick leave. This amendment would eliminate the unfair practice of charging teacher absence due to injuries or illness arising from employment against the annual or accumulated sick leave.
