The Assembly Local Government and Housing Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 788.

The bill permits, at the discretion of the appointing authority of the county, a five-year term upon the reappointment of a county purchasing agent who has attained certification as a county purchasing official pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1981, c.380 (C.40A:9-30.1 et seq.). Currently, county purchasing agents are appointed for three-year terms.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1998-1999 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
