5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the

The Assembly Higher Education and Regulated Professions Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 558.

This bill would establish a distinguished Chair in Women's Studies at Douglass College of Rutgers University. The purpose of the chair is to fund research, teaching and lectures in Women's Studies by an outstanding scholar, who would be appointed by the college for a term of up to two years.

Since fiscal year 1984, an appropriation of \$75,000.00 has been included in the State budget for a Chair of Women's Studies at Douglass College. However, unlike the other distinguished chairs which receive State funding, the Women's Studies Chair has not been established by statute.

In addition to the Women's Studies Chair, the State provides support for: the Einstein Chair for Scholarly Studies at the Institute for Advanced Studies; the Richard J. Hughes Chair for Constitutional and Public Law and Service at Seton Hall University; the Alfred E. Driscoll Chair in Pharmaceutical/Chemical Studies at Fairleigh Dickinson University; the Will and Ariel Durant Chair in the Humanities at St. Peter's College; the Small Business and Entrepreneurship Chair at Rutgers University; and, the Raoul Wallenberg Visiting Professorship in Human Rights at Rutgers University.

Since funds are included in the Governor's budget proposal for FY 1988, there would be no additional cost as a result of this bill.

As reported by committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2515.

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill without committee amendments.

This bill would establish a distinguished Chair in Women's Studies at Douglass College of Rutgers University. The purpose of the chair is to fund research, teaching and lectures in Women's Studies by an outstanding scholar, who would be appointed by the college for a term of up to two years.

Since fiscal year 1984, an appropriation of \$75,000.00 has been included in the State budget for a Chair of Women's Studies at Douglass College. However, unlike the other distinguished chairs which receive State funding, the Women's Studies Chair has not been established by statute.

In addition to the Women's Studies Chair, the State provides support for: The Einstein Chair for Scholarly Studies at the Institute for Advanced Studies; The Richard J. Hughes Chair for Constitutional and Public Law and Service at Seton Hall; The Alfred E. Driscoll Chair in Pharmaceutical/chemical Studies at Fairleigh Dickinson University; The Will and Ariel Durant Chair in the Humanities at St. Peters; the Small Business and Entrepreneurship Chair at Rutgers; and, the Raoul Wallenberg Visiting Professorship in Human Rights at Rutgers.

Since funds are included in the Governor's budget proposal for FY 1988, there would be no additional cost as a result of this bill.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1988 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
