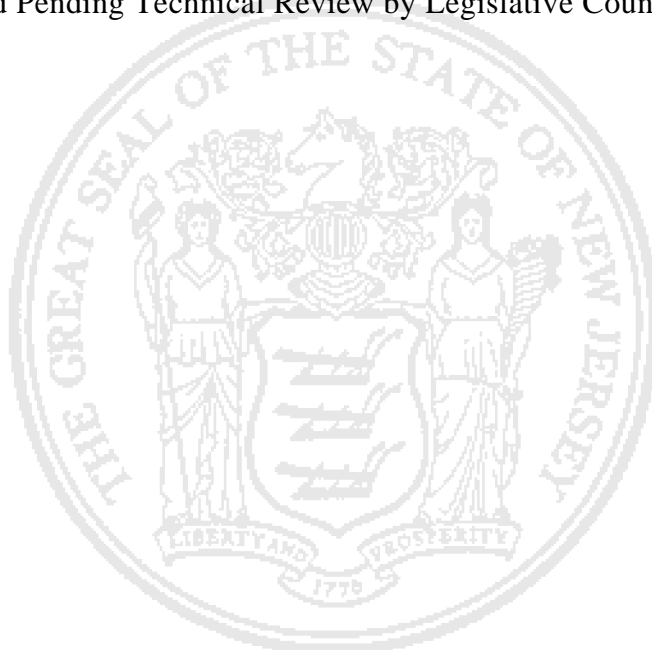

This bill amends N.J.S.A.9:17A-6 to lower the age of consent for minors to donate blood without parental permission to 17 years of age. Under current law, a person 18 years of age or older is allowed to donate blood without parental consent.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2002-2003 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
