The Assembly Higher Education and Regulated Professions Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 2269 (1R).

This bill provides for a 180-day application period for those persons who qualified for licensure on February 1, 1985 as an audiologist or speech-language pathologist, or both, under the grandfather provisions of section 10 of P.L.1983, c.420 (C.45:3B-10), as amended by section 1 of P.L.1987, c.332. That section provides that an applicant for licensure may receive a license without examination if he was actively engaged in the practice of audiology or speech-language pathology, or both, in this State for three of the last five years immediately preceding January 5, 1984 (the enactment date of the act); has a master's degree or its equivalent in speech-language pathology or audiology; meets the currently recognized national professional standards in speech-language pathology or audiology; and demonstrates to the Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs satisfactory knowledge of current developments and procedures in his area of specialization.

The Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs is required to publish at least three times in one or more newspapers circulating in each county in the State, a notice of the application period and a brief description of the eligibility requirements under the grandfather provision.
