PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

AN ACT to reconstitute the list of organizations entitled to delegates to the annual State Agricultural Convention and amending R. S. 4:1-6.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. R. S. 4:1-6 is amended to read as follows:

2 4:1-6. Each county board of agriculture shall be entitled to be
3 represented in the annual convention by two delegates.

4 Each of the following organizations shall be entitled to be rep-
5 resented in the annual convention by one delegate: American

36 Prior to the time fixed for the holding of the annual convention
37 each of the organizations named in this section shall choose from
38 its members the authorized number of delegates and certify to the
39 convention their qualifications as such. The credentials shall be
40 filed with the proper convention officer or committee, and upon the
41 acceptance thereof by the convention such persons shall have all
42 the rights and powers of delegates.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The New Jersey State Agricultural Convention at its annual meeting approved the membership of the New Jersey Horse Council in the Agricultural Convention. This change is favored by all agricultural groups.

Governor Brendan Byrne signed two bills into law today.

The first, A-751, sponsored by Assemblyman Walter Kozloski (D-Monmouth), entitles the New Jersey Horse Council to send delegates to the annual State Agricultural Convention.

Representation of the Horse Council was approved at the last Agricultural Convention by the present members of the State Board of Agriculture.

The second bill, S-871, sponsored by Senator Alfred Beadleston (R-Monmouth) extends the maritime lien law to include charges incurred for drydockage and storage of vessels on land or in the water.
