7 2A:2-1. a. The Superior Court shall consist of not less than
8 [364] 366 judges. Each judge shall receive such annual salary as
9 shall be fixed by law.

The Senate Judiciary Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1932.

This bill would authorize the creation of two additional judgeships for Union County. Union County presently has sixteen authorized judgeships.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
