AN ACT concerning railroads, and amending section 2A:170-60 of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 2A:170-60 of the New Jersey Statutes is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 2A:170-60. Any person who casts, shoots or throws anything at,
4 against or into any vehicle, railroad car, airplane, or other facility of trans-
5 portation, or [who] places any stick, stone or other substance upon any
6 street railway track, trolley track or railroad track, [with intent to injure
7 any car passing thereon, or the passengers therein,] or who unlawfully
8 climbs into or upon any coal car, either in motion or standing [at any of
9 the stations or depots] *on the track* of any railroad company in this State,
10 and throws from the same any coal, or [who] takes up from the tracks or
11 alongside the tracks any coal so thrown from the cars, is a disorderly person.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to strengthen this section of the disorderly persons statute which prohibits the throwing of objects at vehicles, airplanes or

railroad cars and the obstruction of railroad tracks, which create a high risk to the general public, as suggested by the Governor in his conditional veto message of May 17, 1965 with respect to Assembly Bill No. 376 (amended in accordance with his recommendations and approved as Chapter 68, laws of 1965).
