PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

By Assemblyman CODEY

AN ACT concerning certain activities by legislative agents and supplementing the "Legislative Activities Disclosure Act of 1971," approved June 2, 1971 (P. L. 1971, c. 183).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Any legislative agent who knowingly represents an interest  
2 adverse to any of his employer's without first obtaining such  
3 employer's written consent thereto, after full disclosure to such  
4 employer of such adverse interest, shall, upon conviction, be guilty  
5 of a misdemeanor.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Assembly Bill No. 997 would make it a misdemeanor (punishable by a maximum fine of \$1,000.00 and/or a maximum prison term of 3 years) for a lobbyist to represent an interest adverse to that of his employer without making full disclosure thereof and receiving written consent from his employer to do so.
