1991 Assembly No. 4843

1 AN ACT supplementing the "Waterfront Commission Compact,"
2 P.L.1953, c.202 (C.32:23-1 et seq.), and providing for the
3 extension of the term of the license granted to stevedores
4 pursuant to Article VI thereof.

5
6 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
7 State of New Jersey:

8 1. A stevedore's license shall, notwithstanding the provisions
9 of Article VI, paragraph 5 of P.L.1953, c.202 (C.32:23-23) be for
10 a term of three years or fraction of such three year period, and
11 shall expire on the first day of December. In the event of the
12 death of the licensee, if a natural person, or its termination or
13 dissolution by reason of the death of a partner, if a partnership,
14 or if the licensee shall cease to be a party to any contract of the
15 type required by subdivision (d) of paragraph 3 of Article VI
16 (C.32:23-21), the license shall terminate 90 days after such event
17 or upon its expiration date, whichever shall be sooner. A license
18 may be renewed by the commission for successive three year
19 periods upon fulfilling the same requirements as are set forth in
20 Article VI for an original application for a stevedore's license.

21 2. If any part or provision of this act or the application thereof
22 to any person or circumstances be adjudged invalid by any court
23 of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its
24 operation to the part, provision or application directly involved in
25 the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered
26 and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of
27 this act or the application thereof to other persons or
28 circumstances and the two states hereby declare that they would
29 have entered into this act or the remainder thereof had the in
30 validity of such provision or application thereof been apparent.

31 3. This act constitutes an agreement between the states of
32 New Jersey and New York, supplementary to the waterfront
33 commission compact and amendatory thereof, and shall be
34 liberally construed to effectuate the purposes of the compact,
35 and the powers vested in the waterfront commission hereby shall
36 be construed to be in aid of and supplemental to and not in
37 limitation or derogation of any of the powers heretofore
38 conferred upon or delegated to the waterfront commission.

39 4. The State of New York, having enacted L.1986, c.457, a law
40 having an identical effect to this act, this act shall take effect
41 immediately.
