# BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. N.J.S.11A:5-1 is amended to read as follows:

11A:5-1. Definitions. As used in this chapter:

- a. "Disabled veteran" means any veteran who is eligible to be compensated for a service-connected disability from war service by the United States Veterans Administration or who receives or is entitled to receive equivalent compensation for a service-connected disability which arises out of military or naval service as set forth in this chapter and who has submitted sufficient evidence of the record of disability incurred in the line of duty to the commissioner on or before the closing date for filing an application for an examination;
- b. "Veteran" means any honorably discharged soldier, sailor, marine or nurse who served in any army or navy of the allies of the United States in World War I, between July 14, 1914 and November 11, 1918, or who served in any army or navy of the allies of the United States in World War II, between September 1, 1939 and September 2, 1945 and who was inducted into that service through voluntary enlistment, and was a citizen of the United States at the time of the enlistment, and who did not renounce or lose his or her United States citizenship; or any soldier, sailor, marine, airman, nurse or army field clerk, who has served in the active military or naval service of the United States and has been discharged or released under other than dishonorable conditions from that service in any of the following wars or conflicts and who has presented to the commissioner sufficient evidence of the record of service on or before the closing date for filing an application for an examination:
  - (1) World War I, between April 6, 1917 and November 11, 1918;
- (2) World War II, on or after September 16, 1940, who shall have served at least 90 days beginning on or before December 31, 1946 in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which

course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies; except that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service;

- (3) Korean conflict, on or after June 23, 1950, who shall have served at least 90 days beginning on or before January 31, 1955, in active service, exclusive of any period of assignment for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies; except that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service;
- (4) Vietnam conflict, on or after December 31, 1960, who shall have served at least 90 days beginning on or before May 7, 1975, in active service, exclusive of any period of assignment for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, and exclusive of any service performed pursuant to the provisions of section 511(d) of Title 10, United States Code, or exclusive of any service performed pursuant to enlistment in the National Guard or the Army Reserve, Naval Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, or Coast Guard Reserve; except that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service as provided;
- (5) Lebanon peacekeeping mission, on or after September 26, 1982, who has served in Lebanon or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before <u>December 1, 1987 or</u> the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] <u>or</u> Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided;
- (6) Grenada peacekeeping mission, on or after [October 25, 1983] October 23, 1983, who has served in Grenada or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before November 21, 1983 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided;
  - (7) Panama peacekeeping mission, on or after December 20,

1989 or the date of inception of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in Panama or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before January 31, 1990 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided;

- (8) Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" mission in the Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, on or after August 2, 1990 or the date of inception of that operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in the Arabian peninsula or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the Persian Gulf for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or the Governor, whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided.
- c. "War service" means service by a veteran in any war or conflict described in this chapter during the periods specified. (cf: P.L.1991, c.390, s.1)
  - 2. N.J.S.18A:66-2 is amended to read as follows:
  - 18A:66-2. As used in this article:

- a. "Accumulated deductions" means the sum of all the amounts, deducted from the compensation of a member or contributed by or in behalf of the member, including interest credited to January 1, 1956, standing to the credit of the member's individual account in the annuity savings fund.
- b. "Annuity" means payments for life derived from the accumulated deductions of a member as provided in this article.
- c. "Beneficiary" means any person receiving a retirement allowance or other benefit as provided in this article.
- d. "Compensation" means the contractual salary, for services as a teacher as defined in this article, which is in accordance with established salary policies of the member's employer for all employees in the same position but shall not include individual salary adjustments which are granted primarily in anticipation of the member's retirement or additional remuneration for performing temporary or extracurricular duties beyond the regular school day or the regular school year.
- e. "Employer" means the State, the board of education or any educational institution or agency of or within the State by which a teacher is paid.
- f. "Final compensation" means the average annual compensation for which contributions are made for the three

years of creditable service in New Jersey immediately preceding the member's retirement or death, or it shall mean the average annual compensation for New Jersey service for which contributions are made during any three fiscal years of his or her membership providing the largest possible benefit to the member or the member's beneficiary.

- g. "Fiscal year" means any year commencing with July 1, and ending with June 30, next following.
- h. "Pension" means payments for life derived from appropriations made by the State or employers to the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund.
- i. "Annuity reserve" means the present value of all payments to be made on account of any annuity or benefit in lieu of an annuity, granted under the provisions of this article, computed on the basis of such mortality tables recommended by the actuary as the board of trustees adopts, with regular interest.
- j. "Pension reserve" means the present value of all payments to be made on account of any pension or benefit in lieu of a pension granted to a member from the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund, computed on the basis of such mortality tables recommended by the actuary as the board of trustees adopts, with regular interest.
- k. "Present-entrant" means any member of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund who had established status as a "present-entrant member" of said fund prior to January 1, 1956.
- l. "Rate of contribution initially certified" means the rate of contribution certified by the retirement system in accordance with N.J.S.18A:66-29.
- Regular interest" shall mean interest as determined by the State Treasurer, after consultation with the Directors of the Divisions of Investment and Pensions, the board of trustees and the actuary. It shall bear a reasonable relationship to the percentage rate of earnings on investments based on the market value of assets but shall not exceed the assumed percentage rate of increase applied to salaries plus 3%, provided however that the board of trustees shall not set the average percentage rate of increase applied to salaries below 6%.
  - n. "Retirement allowance" means the pension plus the annuity.
- o. "School service" means any service as a "teacher" as defined in this section.
- "Teacher" means any regular teacher, special teacher, teacher, teacher clerk, principal, vice-principal, helping supervisor, supervising principal, director, superintendent, city superintendent, assistant city superintendent, superintendent, State Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner of Education, members of the State Department of Education who are certificated, unclassified professional staff and other members of the teaching or professional staff of any class, public school, high school, normal school, model school, training school, vocational school, truant reformatory school, or parental school, and of any and all classes or schools within the State conducted uncer the order and superintendence, and wholly or partly at the extense of the State Board of Education, of a duly elected or ap ointed board of education, board of school directors, or board

of trustees of the State or of any school district or normal school 1 2 district thereof, and any persons under contract or engagement to 3 perform one or more of these functions. It shall also mean any person who serves, while on an approved leave of absence from 4 regular duties as a teacher, as an officer of a local, county or 5 6 State labor organization which represents, or is affiliated with an 7 organization which represents, teachers as defined in this subsection. No person shall be deemed a teacher within the 8 9 meaning of this article who is a substitute teacher. In all cases of 10 doubt the board of trustees shall determine whether any person is 11 a teacher as defined in this article.

- q. "Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund," hereinafter referred to as the "retirement system" or "system," is the corporate name of the arrangement for the payment of retirement allowances and other benefits under the provisions of this article, including the several funds placed under said system. By that name all its business shall be transacted, its funds invested, warrants for money drawn, and payments made and all of its cash and securities and other property held.
- "Veteran" means any honorably discharged officer, soldier, sailor, airman, marine or nurse who served in any Army, Air Force or Navy of the Allies of the United States in World War I between July 14, 1914, and November 11, 1918, or who served in any Army, Air Force or Navy of the Allies of the United States in World War II, between September 1, 1939, and September 2, 1945, and who was inducted into such service through voluntary enlistment, and was a citizen of the United States at the time of such enlistment, and who did not, during or by reason of such service, renounce or lose United States citizenship, and any officer, soldier, sailor, marine, airman, nurse or army field clerk who has served in the active military or naval service of the United States and has or shall be discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable, in any of the wars, uprisings, insurrections, expeditions emergencies, and who has presented to the retirement system evidence of such record of service in form and content satisfactory to said retirement system:
- (1) The Indian wars and uprisings during any of the periods recognized by the War Department of the United States as periods of active hostility;
- (2) The Spanish-American War between April 20, 1898, and April 11, 1899;
- (3) The Philippine insurrections and expeditions during the periods recognized by the War Department of the United States as of active hostility from February 4, 1899, to the end of 1913;
- (4) The Peking relief expedition between June 20, 1900, and May 27, 1902;
- 48 (5) The army of Cuban occupation between July 18, 1898, and 49 May 20, 1902;
- 50 (6) The army of Cuban pacification between October 6, 1906, 51 and April 1, 1909;
- 52 (7) The Mexican punitive expedition between March 14, 1916, 53 and February 7, 1917;
  - (8) The Mexican border patrol, having actually participated in

engagements against Mexicans between April 12, 1911, and Iune 16, 1919;

- (9) World War I, between April 6, 1917, and November 11, 1918; (10) World War II, between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1946, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, any part of which 90 days was served between said dates; provided that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service as herein provided;
- (11) Korean conflict on or after June 23, 1950, and on or prior to January 31, 1955, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, any part of which 90 days was served between said provided that any person receiving service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service as herein provided; and provided further that any member classed as a veteran pursuant to this subsection prior to August 1, 1966, shall continue to be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person completed the 90-day service between said dates as herein provided;
- (12) Vietnam conflict, on or after December 31, 1960, and on or prior to May 7, 1975, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program, which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, any part of which 90 days was served between said dates; and exclusive of any service performed pursuant to the provisions of section 511(d) of Title 10, United States Code, pursuant to an enlistment in the Army National Guard or as a reserve for service in the Army Reserve, Naval Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, or Coast Guard Reserve; provided that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran, whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service as herein provided;
- (13) Lebanon peacekeeping mission, on or after September 26, 1982, who has served in Lebanon or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before <u>December 1, 1987 or</u> the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] <u>or</u> Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided,

that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided;

- (14) Grenada peacekeeping mission, on or after [October 25, 1983] October 23, 1983, who has served in Grenada or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before November 21, 1983 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided;

- (16) Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" mission in the Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, on or after August 2, 1990 or the date of inception of that operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in the Arabian peninsula or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the Persian Gulf for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or the Governor, whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided.

"Veteran" also means any honorably discharged member of the American Merchant Marine who served during World War II and is declared by the United States Department of Defense to be eligible for federal veterans' benefits.

"Child" means a deceased member's unmarried child either (a) under the age of 18 or (b) of any age who, at the time of the member's death, is disabled because of mental retardation or physical incapacity, is unable to do any substantial, gainful work because of the impairment and the impairment has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months, as affirmed by the medical board.

- t. "Widower" means the man to whom a member was married at least five years before the date of her death and to whom she continued to be married until the date of her death and who was receiving at least one-half of his support from the member in the 12-month period immediately preceding the member's death or the accident which was the direct cause of the member's death. The dependency of such a widower will be considered terminated by marriage of the widower subsequent to the death of the R member. In the event of the payment of an accidental death benefit, the five-year qualification shall be waived.
  - u. "Widow" means the woman to whom a member was married at least five years before the date of his death and to whom he continued to be married until the date of his death and who was receiving at least one-half of her support from the member in the 12-month period immediately preceding the member's death or the accident which was the direct cause of the member's death. The dependency of such a widow will be considered terminated by the marriage of the widow subsequent to the member's death. In the event of the payment of an accidental death benefit, the five-year qualification shall be waived.
  - v. "Parent" means the parent of a member who was receiving at least one-half of the parent's support from the member in the 12-month period immediately preceding the member's death or the accident which was the direct cause of the member's death. The dependency of such a parent will be considered terminated by marriage of the parent subsequent to the death of the member.
  - w. "Medical board" means the board of physicians provided for in N.J.S.18A:66-56.

- 3. Section 6 of P.L.1954, c.84 (C.43:15A-6) is amended to read as follows:
  - 6. As used in this act:
- a. "Accumulated deductions" means the sum of all the amounts, deducted from the compensation of a member or contributed by or on behalf of the member, standing to the credit of the member's individual account in the annuity savings fund.
- b. "Annuity" means payments for life derived from the accumulated deductions of a member as provided in this act.
- c. "Annuity reserve" means the present value of all payments to be made on account of any annuity or benefit in lieu of an annuity, granted under the provisions of this act, computed on the basis of such mortality tables recommended by the actuary as the board of trustees adopts, with regular interest.
- d. "Beneficiary" means any person receiving a retirement allowance or other benefit as provided in this act.
- e. "Child" means a deceased member's unmarried child either (1) under the age of 18 or (2) of any age who, at the time of the member's death, is disabled because of mental retardation or physical incapacity, is unable to do any substantial, gainful work because of the impairment and the impairment has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months, as affirmed by the medical board.
- f. "Parent" shall mean the parent of a member who was receiving at least 1/2 of the parent's support from the member in

"Final compensation" means the average annual compensation for which contributions are made for the three years of creditable service in New Jersey immediately preceding the member's retirement or death, or it shall mean the average annual compensation for New Jersey service for which contributions are made during any three fiscal years of his or her membership providing the largest possible benefit to the member or the member's beneficiary.
- i. "Fiscal year" means any year commencing with July 1 and ending with June 30 next following.
- j. "Medical board" shall mean the board of physicians provided for in section 17 (C.43:15A-17).
- k. "Pension" means payments for life derived from appropriations made by the employer as provided in this act.
- l. "Pension reserve" means the present value of all payments to be made on account of any pension or benefit in lieu of a pension granted under the provisions of this act, computed on the basis of such mortality tables recommended by the actuary as the board of trustees adopts, with regular interest.
- m. "Public Employees' Retirement System of New Jersey," hereinafter referred to as the "retirement system" or "system," is the corporate name of the arrangement for the payment of retirement allowances and other benefits under the provisions of this act including the several funds placed under said system. By that name all of its business shall be transacted, its funds invested, warrants for money drawn, and payments made and all of its cash and securities and other property held.

- (12) Vietnam conflict on or after December 31, 1960, and on or prior to May 7, 1975, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, any part of which 90 days was served between said dates; and exclusive of any service performed pursuant to the provisions of section 511(d) of Title 10, United States Code, pursuant to an enlistment in the Army National Guard or as a reserve for service in the Army Reserve, Naval Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, or Coast Guard Reserve; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 90 days' service as herein provided;
- (13) Lebanon peacekeeping mission, on or after September 26, 1982, who has served in Lebanon or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before December 1, 1987 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided;
- (14) Grenada peacekeeping mission, on or after [October 25, 1983] October 23, 1983, who has served in Grenada or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before November 21, 1983 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided;
- (15) Panama peacekeeping mission, on or after <u>December 20</u>, <u>1989 or</u> the date of inception of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] <u>or</u> Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in Panama or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the

territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before January 31, 1990 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided;

(16) Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" mission in the Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, on or after August 2, 1990 or the date of inception of that operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or the Governor, whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in the Arabian peninsula or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the Persian Gulf for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or the Governor, whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days' service as herein provided.

"Veteran" also means any honorably discharged member of the American Merchant Marine who served during World War II and is declared by the United States Department of Defense to be eligible for federal veterans' benefits.

- q. "Widow" means the woman to whom a member was married at least five years before the date of his death and to whom he continued to be married until the date of his death and who was receiving at least 1/2 of her support from the member in the 12-month period immediately preceding the member's death or the accident which was the direct cause of the member's death. The dependency of such a widow will be considered terminated by the marriage of the widow subsequent to the member's death. In the event of the payment of an accidental death benefit, the five-year qualification shall be waived.
- r. "Compensation" means the base or contractual salary, for services as an employee, which is in accordance with established salary policies of the member's employer for all employees in the same position but shall not include individual salary adjustments which are granted primarily in anticipation of the member's retirement or additional remuneration for performing temporary or extracurricular duties beyond the regular workday or the regular work year. In cases where salary includes maintenance, the retirement system shall fix the value of that part of the salary not paid in money which shall be considered under this act. (cf: P.L.1992, c.125, s.7)

- (3) The Philippine insurrections and expeditions during the periods recognized by the War Department of the United States as of active hostility from February 4, 1899, to the end of 1913;
- (4) The Peking relief expedition between June 20, 1900, and May 27, 1902;
- (5) The army of Cuban occupation between July 18, 1898, and May 20, 1902;
- (6) The army of Cuban pacification between October 6, 1906, and April 1, 1909;
- (7) The Mexican punitive expedition between March 14, 1916, and February 7, 1917;
- (8) The Mexican border patrol, having actually participated in engagements against Mexicans between April 12, 1911, and June 16, 1919;
  - (9) World War I between April 6, 1917, and November 11, 1918;
- (10) World War II, between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1946, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training program which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies any part of which 90 days was served between said dates; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 90-day service as herein provided;
- (11) Korean conflict on or after June 23, 1950, and on or prior to January 31, 1955, who shall have served at least 90 days in such active service, exclusive of any period of assignment (1) for a course of education or training under the Army Specialized Training Program or the Navy College Training Program which course was a continuation of a civilian course and was pursued to completion, or (2) as a cadet or midshipman at one of the service academies, any part of which 90 days was served between said dates; provided, that any person receiving an actual

- (15) Panama peacekeeping mission, on or after <u>December 20</u>, 1989 or the date of inception of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in Panama or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the territorial waters of that nation for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before <u>January 31</u>, 1990 or the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed

by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided;

(16) Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" mission in the Arabian peninsula and the Persian Gulf, on or after August 2, 1990 or the date of inception of that operation, as proclaimed by the President of the United States[,] or Congress [or the Governor], whichever date of inception is earliest, who has served in the Arabian peninsula or on board any ship actively engaged in patrolling the Persian Gulf for a period, continuous or in the aggregate, of at least 14 days commencing on or before the date of termination of that mission, as proclaimed by the President of the United States, Congress or the Governor, whichever date of termination is the latest, in such active service; provided, that any person receiving an actual service-incurred injury or disability shall be classed as a veteran whether or not that person has completed the 14 days service as herein provided.

"Veteran" also means any honorably discharged member of the American Merchant Marine who served during World War II and is declared by the United States Department of Defense to be eligible for federal veterans' benefits.

- (b) "Assessor" means the assessor, board of assessors or any other official or body of a taxing district charged with the duty of assessing real and personal property for the purpose of general taxation.

- (l) "Mutual housing corporation" means a corporation not-for-profit incorporated under the laws of New Jersey on a mutual or cooperative basis within the scope of section 607 of the "National Defense Housing Act," Pub. L.76-849 (42 U.S.C. § 1521 et seq.), which acquired a National Defense Housing Project pursuant to that act.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 7, 1994

The Assembly Veterans, Military Affairs and Gaming Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 485.

This bill establishes in law certain inception and termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama peacekeeping missions and for Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" in order to insure eligibility for certain State benefits for veterans of those missions.

The bill amends five sections of law: 1) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for civil service preference; 2) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for enhanced benefits in the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) and the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) and for the purpose of purchasing service credit for military service by members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS); and 3) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for the annual veterans personal property tax deduction.

The bill establishes: 1) December 1, 1987 as the termination date of the Lebanon peacekeeping mission (the inception date of September 26, 1982 is already provided for in each of the five statutes); 2) October 23, 1983 as the inception date of the Grenada peacekeeping mission (this is changed from the October 25, 1983 date now provided for in law) and November 21, 1983 as the termination date; 3) December 20, 1989 as the inception date for the Panama peacekeeping mission and January 31, 1990 as the termination date; and 4) August 2, 1990 as the inception date of Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" (the termination date remains open). The termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama missions will be later if the termination dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are later than the specific dates noted above, and the inception dates of the Panama mission and Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" will be earlier if the inception dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are earlier than the specific dates noted above.

These dates have been recognized by the United States Department of Defense as the inception and termination dates of these missions for the purpose of establishing eligibility for service medals for members of the United Stated armed forces who participated in these missions.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1994 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

Assembly Bill No. 485 of 1994 establishes certain inception and termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama peacekeeping missions and for Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" in order to insure eligibility for certain State benefits for the veterans of those missions.

The bill amends five sections of law: 1) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for civil service preference; 2) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for enhanced benefits in the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) and the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) and for the purpose of purchasing service credit for military service by members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS); and 3) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for the annual veterans personal property tax rebate.

The bill establishes: 1) December 1, 1987 as the termination date of the Lebanon peacekeeping mission (the inception date of September 26, 1982 is already provided for in each of the five statutes); 2) October 23, 1983 as the inception date of the Grenada peacekeeping mission (this is changed from the October 25, 1983 date now provided for in law) and November 21, 1983 as the termination date; 3) December 20, 1989 as the inception date for the Panama peacekeeping mission and January 31, 1990 as the termination date; and 4) August 2, 1990 as the inception date of Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" (the termination date remains open). (The termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada and Panama missions will be later if the termination dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are later than the specific dates noted above, and the inception dates of the Panama mission and Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" will be earlier if the inception dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are earlier than the specific dates noted above.)

These dates have been recognized by the United States Department of Defense as the inception and termination dates of these missions for the purpose of establishing eligibility for service medals for members of the United States armed forces who participated in these missions.

Neither the Departments of Personnel and Military and Veterans' Affairs nor the Division of Pensions and Benefits have information available to estimate the number of individuals who might be affected by this bill. However, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) believes the number to be small because the date changes are relatively minor and for the Lebanon, Grenada and Panama peacekeeping missions, the number of military personnel involved was minor.

The Department of Personnel, in an estimate prepared for similar legislation (A-1842 of 1992), estimates it will cost approximately \$15,000 to update various forms and brochures, such as the job bulletin, and the Veterans' Preference file. The department states that it has no information available to estimate the number of individuals who might be affected by this legislation.

The OLS notes that special veterans retirement in the PERS is 50 percent of final compensation for veterans age 62 with 20 or more years of service. For members of TPAF special veterans retirement is 50 percent of final compensation for veterans age 60 with 20 or more years of service. The retirement formula for non-veterans is years of service divided by 60 multiplied by the member's highest three years' average salary. Depending on the individual member's circumstances, a veterans benefit can provide an enhancement of 50 percent over the non-veteran service retirement benefit. However, the OLS believes that on average the veteran benefit is probably only 20 percent greater.

The OLS estimates that the additional cost of a PERS member qualifying for the special veterans' retirement is about \$1,200 per year over the life of the retirement system or about 13 years. In present value dollars, the liability would be approximately \$9,900 more than a non-veteran service retirement. This cost would increase as the retiree became eligible for cost-of-living adjustments (COLA). The OLS estimates the present value of the future COLA adjustments at approximately \$6,000. The OLS notes that the special veterans' retirement in TPAF is slightly more costly because of the earlier retirement age.

The OLS also notes individuals who meet the qualifications of veteran under this bill or their surviving spouse will be entitled to a \$50 property tax exemption.

  - (e) "Pre-tax year" means the particular calendar year immediately preceding the "tax year."
  - (f) "Resident" means one legally domiciled within the State of New Jersey. Mere seasonal or temporary residence within the State, of whatever duration, shall not constitute domicile within the State for the purposes of this act. Absence from this State for a period of 12 months shall be prima facie evidence of abandonment of domicile in this State. The burden of establishing legal domicile within the State shall be upon the claimant.
  - (g) "Tax year" means the particular calendar year in which the general property tax is due and payable.
  - (h) "Veteran" means any citizen and resident of this State honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active service in time of war in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States.
  - (i) "Veteran's deduction" means the deduction against the taxes payable by any person, allowable pursuant to this act.
  - (j) "Surviving spouse" means the surviving wife or husband of any of the following, while he or she is a resident of this State, during widowhood or widowerhood:
  - 1. A citizen and resident of this State who has died or shall die while on active duty in time of war in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States; or
  - 2. A citizen and resident of this State who has had or shall hereafter have active service in time of war in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States and who died or shall die while on active duty in a branch of the Armed Forces of the United States; or
  - 3. A citizen and resident of this State who has been or may hereafter be honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active service in time of war in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States.
  - (k) "Cooperative" means a housing corporation or association incorporated or organized under the laws of New Jersey which entitles a shareholder thereof to possess and occupy for dwelling purposes a house, apartment or other structure owned or leased by the corporation or association;
  - (l) "Mutual housing corporation" means a corporation not-for-profit incorporated under the laws of New Jersey on a mutual or cooperative basis within the scope of section 607 of the "National Defense Housing Act," Pub. L.76-849 (42 U.S.C. § 1521 et seq.), which acquired a National Defense Housing Project pursuant to that act.

### **STATEMENT**

 The purpose of this bill is to establish in law certain inception and termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama peacekeeping missions and for Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" in order to insure eligibility for certain State benefits for veterans of those missions.

The bill amends five sections of law: 1) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for civil service preference; 2) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for enhanced benefits in the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF) and the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) and for the purpose of purchasing service credit for military service by members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS); and 3) the definition of "veteran" for the purpose of eligibility for the annual veterans personal property tax rebate.

The bill establishes: 1) December 1, 1987 as the termination date of the Lebanon peacekeeping mission (the inception date of September 26, 1982 is already provided for in each of the five statutes); 2) October 23, 1983 as the inception date of the Grenada peacekeeping mission (this is changed from the October 25, 1983 date now provided for in law) and November 21, 1983 as the termination date; 3) December 20, 1989 as the inception date for the Panama peacekeeping mission and January 31, 1990 as the termination date; and 4) August 2, 1990 as the inception date of Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" (the termination date remains open). (The termination dates for the Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama missions will be later if the termination dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are later than the specific dates noted above, and the inception dates of the Panama mission and Operation "Desert Shield/Desert Storm" will be earlier if the inception dates proclaimed by the President or Congress are earlier than the specific dates noted above.)

These dates have been recognized by the United States Department of Defense as the inception and termination dates of these missions for the purpose of establishing eligibility for service medals for members of the United Stated armed forces who participated in these missions.
