AN ACT to repeal sections 11 through 16 of the "New Jersey Meat and Poultry Inspection Act," approved June 24, 1968 (P. L. 1968, c. 105).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Sections 11 through 16 of P. L. 1968, c. 105 (C. 24:16B-11 to
2 24:16B-16) are repealed.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately, and be retroactive to
2 July 1, 1976.

STATEMENT

The Federal government has assumed the State's former responsibility for inspection of meat packaging and labeling in New Jersey. Since the State is no longer providing inspection services nor incurring program costs, affected New Jersey businesses should be relieved of license fees. This bill would repeal the applicable State license requirement and the fees for such licenses to reflect the assumption of the responsibilities and costs by the Federal government. In anticipation of this bill's approval, the current budget for the Department of Agriculture does not anticipate the \$33,000.00 annual revenue provided by these fees.
