1 AN ACT concerning judges of the Superior Court in certain
counties and amending N.J.S. 2A:2-1.

BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
5 *State of New Jersey:*

1. N.J.S. 2A:2-1 is amended to read as follows:

7 2A:2-1. a. The Superior Court shall consist of not less than
[349] 350 judges. Each judge shall receive such annual salary as
9 shall be fixed by law.

b. (1) The Superior Court shall at all times consist of the
11 following number of judges of each county who at the time of
their appointment and reappointment were residents of that
13 county:
